

"I can't think of a better organization to work with," said Dan Neal. Nick Comstock added, "The work URS does with the children they help is phenomenal. It is a great partnership." 



#### Female welder loves her work! Milton Union grad likes her career path. Learning a trade paved a new direction.



Like many young adults, Erin Hause of Dayton began thinking about her future early. And though her father was a carpenter by trade, involved his daughter in many of his jobs and taught her to build, the 2007 graduate of Milton Union High School planned to go to a traditional college.

"I started going to Sinclair (Community College) for liberal arts and kept changing my mind," Hause said. "I also majored in psychology and even mechanical engineering."

Hause thought engineering would translate into a good career, particularly since she loved working with her hands. After Sinclair, she transferred to Edison State

College and even considering becoming an Emergency Medical Technician. But she was floundering.

Hause said, "Then a friend mentioned that I look into welding as a professional career." She made an appointment with Hobart Welding School in Troy and said it immediately felt right.

When Hause graduated from the welding program, there were recruiters waiting to snatch her up, and she immediately found a job with Northrup Grumman. "I want to Mississippi and worked on Navy ships and airplanes," she said. When she was laid off six months later, Hause had an opportunity to return to Ohio and enter an apprenticeship program through the sheet metal workers union in Dayton that would provide her with hands-on training working side by side with experienced journeymen.

Hause, who, as a female welder, understands she is in the minority, said that never deterred her from following her heart. "A lot of people think welding is a dirty job or there is a lot of heavy work that females can't do," she said. "But that's not the case. It's really great for me because I'm doing something different every day. I tell my friends if they are not interested in welding, there are a lot of other trades, like bricklayers, painters and carpenters."

Eugene Frazier, administrator of the Joint Apprenticeship Training (JATC) program with the sheet metal workers local 24, said that young people like Erin are more often beginning to question the return on investment of traditional college degrees.

"We are bringing in about 70-100 school counselors each year to educate them about our progams," Frazier said. "We want people to know there are other options out there and you don't have to come out of school with a \$50,000-\$100,000 debt." Frazier said the apprenticeship program is a great way for adults to get training and valuable work experience at the same time. The program is five years long, but during that time, apprentices are paid 45 percent of a journeyman's wage, receive full benefits and up to 144 hours of classroom study for year

"A first-year apprentice can make up to \$21 an hour right out of the gate," Frazier said. "And we cover the cost of their school. We invest about \$7,000 into each student, so we really want them to succeed."


Frazier said the application process is stringent, because they want apprentices that are serious about making the trade a career.

When Hause entered the apprentice program about 18 months ago, she began working at Kerber Sheet Metal in Troy.

Kerber President Kathy Kerber says that Hause is one of her better employees. "I was immediately blown away by Erin's work ethic." Kerber said.

Kerber said the demand for welders will grow as more longtime career professionals continue to retire.

#### Miami Valley Hospital South and Danis-Wise complete construction on Comprehensive Cancer Center New five-story, 93,000-square-foot facility is first-of-its-kind cancer center in Greater Dayton



**DAYTON, Ohio – February 11, 2013 –** Danis Building Construction and Wise Construction Company, providers of construction services for public and private commercial and industrial projects, recently finished constructing the Miami Valley Hospital South Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Danis-Wise started the project in October 2011 and finished ahead of schedule to be open for the New Years Eve Gala on December 31, 2012. The Comprehensive Cancer Center accepted its first patients on Jan. 24, 2013.

"The Miami Valley Hospital South Comprehensive Cancer Center will serve as an integral part of the medical community in the Greater Dayton area," said Danis project manager Greg Morris. "Danis-Wise has enjoyed a positive working relationship with MVHS. We're proud of the work we've accomplished here and know it will be a valuable resource for the Dayton community and beyond."



The new MVHS Comprehensive Cancer Center

is the first cancer center of its kind in Dayton. It houses the TruBeam linear accelerator, an advanced technology that provides precise radiation to fight cancerous tumors. Installing the

linear accelerator required lasers built into the four walls and ceiling surrounding the isocenter, where patients receive radiation treatment. Lasers were measured equidistant from each other for radiation to hit the same body areas during a series of treatments. The room's walls were also built eight-feet thick to avoid radiation leakage.

"The TruBeam linear accelerator is the first technology of its kind in the Dayton area," said Elizabeth Koelker, administrative director of oncology at MVHS. "With this machine, we can deliver a stronger dose of radiation with more precision at quicker intervals. We're excited to provide patients with this new cancer resource and see it as a major health care benefit for the region."

In addition to the linear accelerator, the facility includes office space for 35 physicians offering medical and radiation oncology. Danis-Wise also developed a healing garden with a water sphere and stream that can be seen from patients' windows.

Throughout the project, Danis-Wise and MVHS collaborated to keep the main hospital's business running as usual without construction interruptions. Danis worked directly with the building owner's representative and security to coordinate staff, visitor and patient safety with designated parking and fencing. As a result of the partnership, MVHS and Danis-Wise opened the region's first comprehensive cancer center 1.5 months early.

"Going into this project, we knew it was crucial for the main hospital to stay open throughout construction," said Danis-Wise project engineer Raven Williams. "We met with the MVHS directors early in the process to decide how to keep patients, visitors and staff safe during construction. Through our continuous communication efforts, MVHS kept business running as usual. We adjusted our schedule to stay out of their way while still finishing ahead of schedule."

#### A Message from CareWorks Consultants, Inc. The DBX Workers' Comp. Group Third Party Administrator

In May 2010, Governor John Kasich signed into law a bill focused on pain management clinics. Some clinics had been referred to as "pill mills" and were targeted by health officials for contributing to prescription drug misuse and overdose deaths in Ohio.

In coordination with the Governor's actions, the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC) also took steps to help curtail and eliminate prescription drug abuse within Ohio's workers' compensation system. BWC's strategy included formulary changes and working closely with their pharmacy benefits vendor to screen prescriptions unrelated to a claim and ensure drug relevancy in the treatment of Ohio's injured workers.

In addition, BWC continues to work with multiple state agencies to find and eliminate pain management clinics causing drug misuse, abuse or overdoses which harm patients and the system.

Effective January 2012, BWC began allowing Ohio Workers' Compensation Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) to initiate the Drug Utilization Review (DUR) process. This partnership allows MCOs to review injured worker medications, potentially recognize dangerous dosages or combinations and identify overutilization or inappropriate medications being paid in a claim. BWC's pharmacy staff also implemented bi-weekly conference calls with MCOs to help identify problem providers and other issues related to narcotics and prescription medications.

CareWorks, the endorsed MCO of (NAME OF ASSOCIATION OR CHAMBER), has conducted drug reviews since 2006, clinically reviewing claims for potential narcotic abuse, appraising if medications are related to a claim and identifying multiple prescribers. CareWorks' nurses and medical case specialists review pharmacy reports to ensure medications, dosages and costs are appropriate for the type and severity of an injury. CareWorks ensures a response to the DUR and monitors medication payments when payment has been denied in a claim.

In a recent a CareWorks report -(workers' compensation claims with dates of injury from January 1, 2008 through December 31, 2012), prescribed medications used to treat injured workers represented three percent of total medical costs. While these expenses may be considered small compared to other medical service costs, the health dangers of not receiving appropriate pharmaceutical care can negatively impact an injured worker's recovery and their ability to return to work, which in turn can impact their family and their employer.

It's important for government agencies and Ohio's workers' compensation community to work together to eliminate prescription drug misuse and abuse in Ohio. #### Texas Firm Pays \$214,398 in Back Overtime

Austin Industrial Services LP has paid \$214,398 in overtime back wages to 13 employees for violations of the Fair Labor Standards Act, the Labor Department announced Feb. 6.

Austin Industrial Inc., which is based in La Porte, Texas, provides maintenance and construction work for the Phillips 66 Inc. oil and gas refinery in Borger, Texas.

An investigation by DOL's Wage and Hour Division revealed the employer did not pay overtime compensation to managers who were promised a salary but then were paid on an hourly basis under which their salaries were docked when they worked less than 40 hours a week. Employees regularly worked more than 50 hours but did not receive time and one-half their regular pay rates for their work hours beyond 40 in a workweek, DOL said.

Additionally, the company did not maintain accurate records of work hours as required by the FLSA, according to DOL. A DOL spokesman told BNA Feb. 6 that the investigative period is from Jan. 1, 2011 to June 19, 2012.



#### Fast Approaching is the Date to Post OSHA Recordkeeping

It's that time of year when safety professionals and those professionals tabbed with completing the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) recordkeeping requirements for their organization's 300 log. As required by the OSHA recordkeeping standard 29 CFR 1904, employers must have their 300A summary form completed, signed, and posted from **February 1**, 2012 to April 30, 2012.

The purpose of this OSHA rule is to require employers to record and report work-related fatalities, injuries and illnesses. Note: recording and reporting a work-related injury, illness or fatality does not mean that the employer or employee was at fault, merely an OSHA rule has been violated or that the employee is eligible for workers' compensation or other benefits.

An OSHA recordable is a work-related injury or illness that meets one of the following criteria and should be included on your organizations 300 log form:

- death
- loss of consciousness
- davs away from work
- restricted work activity or job transfer, or medical treatment beyond first aid.
- any needlestick injury or cut from a sharp object that is contaminated with another person's blood or other potentially infectious material
- any case requiring an employee to be medically removed under the requirements of an OSHA health standard
- tuberculosis infection as evidenced by a positive skin test or diagnosis by a physician or other licensed health care professional after exposure to a known case of active tuberculosis.
- an employee's hearing test reveals that he/she has experienced a Standard Threshold Shift (STS) in hearing: in one or both ears of 10 decibels (dB); and the employee's total hearing level is 25 decibels or more above audiometric zero in the same ear(s) as the STS.

As your organization is compiling your 300A, it is important that you identify if the incident resulted in restricted work activity, or days away from work. Restricted work activity occurs when an employer or health care professional keeps, or recommends keeping an employee from doing the routine functions of his or her job or from working their scheduled full workday. Days away from work include any calendar day, after the date of injury, which the employee is unable to work.

Counting the number of calendar days the employee was on restricted work activity or was away from work as a result of the recordable injury or illness is a requirement of the 300 log. Do not count the day on which the injury or illness occurred, rather begin counting days from the day after the incident occurred. If a single injury or illness involved both days away from work and days of restricted work activity, enter the total number of days for each. You may stop counting days of restricted work activity or days away from work once the total of either or the combination of both reaches 180 days.
