

As the Internet becomes a more dangerous place, we are increasingly seeing our clients taking solid steps to protect their computer systems. These steps often include tightening up web browser permissions. However, many of these security measures also serve to disable meaningful web applications as well.

A valuable tool for designating which Internet sites should be allowed to deliver software services over the web is Internet Explorer's **Trusted Sites** list. Any sites appearing on this list are permitted to operate normally without compromising the overall security of the client machine

In order for NOCTI's Online Testing and Client Services site to function normally, **\*.nocti.org** must appear in the client workstation's Trusted Sites list. Below are instructions on how to make this so.


### Step 1

- Right click on the Internet Explorer icon on the desktop
- Click on the **Security** tab
- Select the **Trusted Sites** icon
- Press the **Sites** button




### Step 2

- A Trusted Sites window will appear
- Enter \*.nocti.org
- Click the **Add** button



### Step 3

- **\*.nocti.org** will show in the Web Sites section
- Click **OK**



### Step 4

- Check your security setting by clicking on
