Changes to Principal Expense Reports

On December 20, 2010, the lobbying community received new guidance from the NC Secretary of State for the 4th Quarter Principal Expense Reports, which required that the allocation of principal expense reporting for compensation to lobbyists be broken down into multiple categories. Being regulated by multiple sources - statute, State Ethics Commission opinions, and the regulations and forms of the NC Secretary of State's office - makes our job challenging. We want to adhere to the letter of the law but sometimes find regulatory forms challenging to comply with. The most recent example was the form created by the Secretary of State that would require lobbyists to break down their compensation in six different categories. We did not believe that was the intent of the General Assembly, and it was impracticable from a compliance standpoint.

Led by our President Amy Fullbright, over the Christmas and New Year's holiday weekends, many people in this Association worked to ensure that these lobbyist reporting guidelines were changed. Most notably, working with President Fullbright, was John Mc-Millan, John Policastro, Bill Scoggin, George Teague, and Susan Valauri who consulted, advised and met with legislators and staff to achieve a most favorable result. As you will note, while still requiring a breakdown of compensation paid to each lobbyist, the allocations of individual categories of lobbying activities are no longer required on the Principal Expense Reports. We appreciate the NC Secretary of State's Office and members of the NC General Assembly for working with us to ensure our regulations are clear and practical, while serving the public interest. On behalf of all lobbyists, many thanks to those who worked on getting these important changes made.

NCPLA Membership Directories Available

The new NCPLA Membership Directories are here and available for pick up in the Phone Room at the Legislative Building.

NCPLA members will each receive two copies of the Directory simply by going to the Phone Room and signing for them. Copies of the new Directory have also been distributed to the Legislative Branch as well as the Executive Branch.

General Assembly Web Site Has New Look

You have likely already noticed the new look of the NC General Assembly Web site (www.ncleg.net), which went live on January 1. According to NCGA Web Manager Kelly Stallings, the goal was to refresh the appearance of the site, but maintain the organization. "The good news is that there is a new look," said Stallings. "The better news is that everyone will still be able to find the information they need where they're used to looking for it." Stalling's said, beyond the cosmetic refinements, the main change is to the search function, now featured prominently on the top banner of the NCGA home page. The Web site also features updated directory listings on all members of the 2011-2012 General Assembly.

Stallings hinted that further changes would be made after session begins, at the instruction of the new leadership. She also said the Web site would be expanded to include more information on redistricting.


