

DIRECTIONS TO THE THE WESTIN HOTEL

From the South:

Take I-71 North. Just before reaching the downtown area, exit I-70 East. Take the first exit, which is Front/ High Street. Go straight to High Street and turn left. The Westin is approximately 3 blocks on your right. Parking entrance is on Main Street.

From the North:

Take I-71 South to I-670 West. Take 670 – Dayton/Airport exit, veer to right, merging with traffic in your left two lanes. Follow directions to Third Street. Take the Third Street exit and go 11 blocks to Mound Street and turn right on Mound. Go one block to High Street and turn right. The Westin is at the corner of High and Main Streets. Parking lot entrance is on Main Street.

From the West:

Take I-70 East to the Front/High Street exit. Go straight off the exit to High Street and turn left. Approximately 3 blocks you will see the Westin on your right at Main Street. Parking lot entrance is on Main Street.

From the East:

Take I-70 West to the Fourth Street exit. Stay in the middle lane. Proceed straight through the first light. Approximately 3 blocks turn right on to High Street. The Westin is at the corner of High and Main Streets. Parking lot entrance is on Main Street.
