

OHIO HIGH SCHOOL BASEBALL COACHES ASSOCIATION FACT SHEET – 2015

The purpose of the OHSBCA is to unify all baseball coaches in the State of Ohio, to promote high school baseball, to create an official line of communication with the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA), to foster higher standards of professionalism and ethics, and to maintain a strong contact with the national, state and local coaches organizations of baseball.

Membership: approximately 1500 coaches annually.

Dues: \$25 per year due by February 15th (payable to Treasurer)

Governing Body: Twenty-five member Board of Directors with twelve serving on the executive board.

OFFICIAL ORGANIZATION FUNCTION/EVENTS:

- A. Annual Convention and Clinic: Held once per year at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Columbus, OH
- **B. Board Meetings:** Four times per year. Includes two meetings at the annual convention, a meeting at the Mizuno All-Star Series, and a meeting in October.
- C. OHSBCA Website: www.ohsbca.org
- **D.** Mizuno Senior All-Star Series: Held one week after the state tournament in June. The series honors eighty (80) graduated seniors and twelve member coaches in a 4 team round -robin format. The event takes place at Bill Davis Stadium on the campus of The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio.
- **E.** State Coaches Poll: Teams are rated in each of the four divisions five times each spring. Poll champions are recognized at the annual convention. There are thirty two (32) voting coaches in each division. Registration and membership forms to vote and team discussion forums can be found on web site.
- **F.** All- State Coaches Poll Team: The poll coaches in each division select an all-state team. All grade level of players are eligible. Each division selects a Player –of-the- Year and a Coach-of-the-Year. They are recognized by the wire services and are awarded a plaque at the annual convention.
- **G. Player -of-the-Year Award:** This award will be presented at the annual convention banquet by **Pukka Headware.** Each of the four division Player-of-the-Year recipients will be recognized and one Player-of-the-Year will receive a plaque.
- **H.** Hall of Fame: The HOF induction is the highlight of the awards banquet at the annual convention. The Board of Directors select inductees. Nomination forms can be found on web site.
- **I. Scholarships:** All graduating senior students of member coaches with five years of continuing membership are eligible. They are presented during the awards banquet. Form found on web site.
- **J. Academic All-Ohio:** Selected annually and awarded certificates. Certificates are handed out at the following year in October or at the state convention. Forms can be found on web site.
- **K.** Service and Victory Awards: Service awards for coaches begin with the fifteenth year of membership and are awarded every five years thereafter. Victory awards begin at 100 and are awarded for every 100 victories thereafter. Certificates and plaques are awarded at the state convention.
- L. Assistant Coach of the Year Award: Coaches from each district are recognized as assistant coaches of the year at our annual convention.
- **M. Team Ohio:** The OHSBCA is a major financial benefactor for Team Ohio. Team Ohio is a team of high school all-stars from Ohio who compete in the Heartland Classic. The Heartland Classic is an eight-state tournament held each year in Norman, Oklahoma, home of Oklahoma University.
- N. Past Presidents Hall of Fame: All former OHSBCA Presidents and Hall of Fame members are invited back for the Hall of Fame Banquet on Friday afternoon.
- **O.** The Consultant of the OHSBCA regularly attends all meetings of the OHSAA Board of Control in Columbus.
- P. Sponsorships: The OHSBCA is sponsored by many corporations and also help sponsor our scholarship recipients: Rawlings (official baseball, uniform, helmet and Hall of Fame Banquet Sponsor), Pukka (official headware), Mizuno (Senior All-Star Game Sponsor), Miller Net (official net), Game Changer, Holloway and Easton.



2015 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE Bruce Cahill – Tippecanoe High School



Bruce Cahill is a 1975 graduate of Troy High School and a 1979 graduate of Miami University where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Education. He has two Masters Degrees from the University of Dayton in School Administration and Counseling.

Coach Cahill is currently in his 34th year of coaching high school baseball; 2 years as a Varsity Head Coach at Carlisle High School, 2 years as a JV coach at Tippecanoe High School and the past 29 years at Tippecanoe High School as the Varsity Head Coach. Coach Cahill also coached football for 9 years. His varsity baseball teams have a combined record of 587 wins and 253 losses, a remarkable winning percentage of .699. Under his tenure the Tippecanoe baseball team has won 19 conference championships, 13 Sectional titles, 7 District titles with 1 Regional runner-up. Bruce has been fortunate to have sent over 65 players on to the collegiate level including 4 who have been drafted by the Major Leagues. He has had 18 players make 1st team All-Ohio while many others have received state recognition. Bruce feels blessed to have had so

many great assistant coaches over the years that have made a huge impact on Tippecanoe High School baseball. Bruce is a member of the Miami Valley Baseball Coaches Association and has served as the President and the Hall of Fame Chairman. He was inducted into the Miami Valley Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2001 and has been that association's coach of the year on 10 occasions. Bruce has also had the honor of coaching in the Mizuno Senior All-Star series twice. He is also a member of the OHSBCA and is currently serving a two-year term as the Southwest District Representative on the Board of Directors.

Bruce has been married to his wife Patty for 19 years. Patty is an intervention specialist at Tippecanoe High School. Bruce has 4 daughters: Jennifer, a graduate of Miami University, lives in Indianapolis and works for Project Lead the Way; Kristin, a graduate of Miami University and the University of Michigan, lives in Ann Arbor and works for the Michigan Alzheimer's Disease Center; Bailey, a senior at Tippecanoe High School will be attending the University of Toledo on a swimming scholarship; and Cameron, a junior at Tippecanoe High School also swims and plays soccer.

2015 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE Chris Kaczmar – Walsh Jesuit High School



Chris Kaczmar is a 1988 graduate of Walsh Jesuit High School and a 1992 graduate of Miami University where he earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in Architecture. Upon graduation, he began working at the family business of Kaczmar Architects Incorporated where he is still employed. In 1999 he earned his license as a State of Ohio Registered Architect (NCARB).

Coach Kaczmar returned to his high school alma mater as an assistant baseball coach in the 1995 season and then was named the head coach in 1997. During the past 18 years as head coach, his teams have won 8 conference championships, 16 Sectional titles, 11 District titles, 3 Regional runner-up finishes, 6 Regional titles, 2 State runner-up finishes, and 4 State Championships. His teams have also earned 2 State Poll Championships, 2014 being the latest, as well as 4 State Poll runner-up finishes. Over those 18 years as head coach, the Warriors have a 444-83 record; an astounding winning percentage of .843. Chris has also earned

many local Coach of the Year awards as well as national recognition for ABCA Midwest Regional Coach of the Year 3 times, NFHS Coach of the Year Finalist 4 times including the top honor in 2011, the National Easton Sports Master Coach Award winner in 2011, and the Ohio Division II Coach of the Year in 2007. In 2010 he was inducted into the North East Ohio Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

He and his wife of 18 years, Bethany, have four children: Emma (15), Stanley (13), Henry (11) and Lucille (9).



2015 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE Kyle Reiser – Elmwood High School



Kyle Reiser graduated from Bowling Green State University in 1983 with a degree in Business Education and received his Master's Degree in Classroom Technology from Bowling Green State University in 2006. After graduating he taught High School Business and was the Varsity Baseball coach three years at Elmwood High School. Kyle then served as Assistant Baseball Coach at Ball State University for two years and Assistant Baseball Coach at Bowling Green State University for one year.

Coach Reiser returned to Elmwood High School as the Middle School Technology teacher and Head Varsity Baseball Coach for the 1991 season. He continues to serve in that capacity, now entering his 30th year of coaching high school baseball: 1 year as JV coach at Eastwood High School, 1 year as Varsity Head Coach at Tinora High School, and 28 years at Elmwood High School as the Varsity Head Coach. During that time his varsity teams have compiled a 518-216 record, an amazing winning percentage of .706. His teams have won 16 conference championships, 20 Sectional titles, 8 District titles, 2 Regional Runner-up titles, and a

State Runner-up finish in 2007. Kyle has been fortunate to have had many outstanding assistant coaches during his tenure, many of them former players, and is proud of the fact that some have gone on to be head coaches at other schools. He has had the privilege of coaching some outstanding baseball players with 10 former college Division I student-athletes and 15 in Division II and III.

Kyle is married to Kelli who also works for Elmwood Schools in the Treasurer's Office. They have four daughters: Kylie, a graduate of BGSU who works for Dana Corporation; Katie, a graduate of Kent State University who works for Goodyear; Kori, currently a student-athlete in the track program at BGSU studying Education; and Kristi, a senior at Elmwood where she is a cheerleader and all-conference softball player.

2015 HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE Jim Wharton – Convoy Crestview High School



Jim Wharton is a 1979 graduate of Snider High School in Fort Wayne, Indiana where he played football and baseball for the Panthers. He then attended Manchester University continuing his athletic career playing both baseball and football for the Spartans. Jim graduated from Manchester University in 1983 with a Bachelor's degree in Health/Physical Education and Psychology.

During his student teaching assignment at Northrop High School in Ft. Wayne, he was the benefactor of coaching under Indiana Hall of Fame coach Chris Stavreti while working with a freshman catcher by the name of Eric Wedge (former Cleveland Indians and Seattle Mariners manager). This 1983 team won the Indiana State Baseball Championship. Jim crossed the state line in 1984 being blessed by the hiring of Crestview High School as a Health/Physical Education teacher along with Head Baseball and Football responsibilities. With the 2015 season, Jim begins his 32nd year of teaching and coaching at Crestview. As the head baseball coach for 31 years, the Knights have compiled a record of 516-241; a

remarkable winning percentage of .682. This includes 17 Northwest Conference titles, 22 Sectional championships, 8 District championships, 3 Regional championships, and 3 State Final Four appearances (1993, 2013, and 2014). In 2014 Jim was honored by the OHSBCA with his selection as Coach of The Year in Division IV. The Knights have placed 147 All Conference players in the N.W.C, 74 being named First Team, 18 Academic All State, 4 Mizuno Senior All-Star players, and 17 earning All State recognition. He has had 21 players go on to play college baseball, with one being drafted and signing professionally. Amazingly, 9 former players are currently coaching high school or college baseball. Coach Wharton is extremely blessed and fortunate to be a part of a staff and community that has been so supportive of all Crestview activities with a desire to maintain excellence. The success the Crestview baseball program has attained over the past 31 years is attributed to Coach Wharton's longtime dedicated and loyal assistant coaches and exceptionally fine young men, who have given so much to perpetuate the Knight Baseball mission.

Coach Wharton's greatest accomplishment has been his family where he has been married to his wife, Cami, for 30 years. Cami is employed by Blackhawk Ministries as a receptionist. They have 4 wonderful children: Becca, married to Kyle Smith (Stony Brook University Football Coach), is a Purdue University graduate and is the Head Clinical Dietitian at Sayville Nursing and Rehab in Sayville, New York who was a 2008 OHSBCA Hank Miller Memorial scholarship recipient; Riley is a graduate of Indiana University and works for Federated Media as a Marketing Consultant in Fort Wayne; Jenna is currently a senior at IPFW majoring in Elementary Education; and Michael is a senior at Blackhawk Christian High School in Fort Wayne.

2014 O.H.S.B.C.A. HANK MILLER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

Each year the Board of Directors selects several individuals to be awarded our "Hank Miller Memorial Scholarship". An eligible applicant must be a graduating son or daughter of a coach who has been an OHSBCA member for a minimum of five consecutive years. This year 10 worthy students have been awarded a \$500 scholarship. Hank Miller, Canton McKinley High School, was inducted into the OHSBCA Hall of Fame in 1975. Hank was a teacher of Industrial Arts and Vocational Carpentry for 39 years. He retired from Canton City Schools in 1989. He coached many sports including tennis, golf, basketball, but football and undoubtedly baseball were his favorites.

He was a World War II veteran who served in the Marine Corps. Hank graduated from Canton Township High School (Canton South) in 1942 and earned his college degree from Ohio Northern. His coaching career started at Mogadore High School with coaching stints at Louisville, Canton Lincoln, Canton McKinley, and Glen Oak High Schools. 
2014 Season Highlights



HITTER'S FOUR MOMENTS OF TRUTH What every hitter must do to make consistent, powerful contact

#1. Position at Heel Down. Gotta Start Right to Finish Right

ATHLETIC STANCE: Knees inside ankles, toes pointing straight ahead

ATHLETIC POSTURE: Weight on balls of feet, slight chest lean forward, butt sticking out

TWO EYES ON PITCHER: Eyes level to ground

WHIPPING GRIP: Knocking knuckles somewhat lined up to get proper whip action of barrel

RHYTHM: The body must stay in motion to work fast

LOAD: We must take energy back before we take it forward. Load is NOT a rock backwards. Weight stays on inside part of back leg and foot.

STRIDE: Back side must gain ground with front side. Think of the stride as the back knee pushing the stride foot forward. Stride must go right toward pitcher. Stride length is a function of stance width and height. Adult strength hitters should land approximately 60% of their height.

TOE TOUCH: The front foot initially lands on the inside pad of the front big toe. Then the heel plants.

BALANCED: Body is in a 50/50 balanced position when the stride foot lands. Head is centered.

HANDS BACK: When the stride foot lands, the hands are shoulder level at or just inside back elbow.

KNOB AT CATCHER: The knob of the bat will point to the catcher's feet when you land. This will allow you to get your hands in a straight path to the ball as the bat is "pulled" with both hands.

#2. Knee Pinch. The First Domino To Fall

KNEE PINCH/HIP ROTATION: The inside of the back knee is the first "domino" to fall. It pinches toward the front inside ankle before turning. The hips will turn the lower body. It is not a "squish the bug" movement (which would be the foot turning the lower body). Usually the hips will pull the foot up onto the toe with the shoelaces facing the pitcher as the swing develops.

#3. Maintain Wrist Angle!

HANDS ON-LINE: Keep those wrists "cocked" until contact. The wrist angle at "Heel Down" is maintained until they unfold just prior to contact. Think of the hands working in a nearly straight path to and through the ball. The back elbow will come just inside the rib cage instead of away from the body. Hands and back elbow pass by the back hip at the same time. We call that "connection." Bat shaft passes close to shoulder.

#4. Extension After Contact

DON'T ROLL THOSE WRISTS: The barrel follows, or chases the ball off the bat until the arms get locked out in front of you. We want to keep our energy behind the ball in a direct line. So many kids roll their wrists just prior to contact or just after. Pushing through at contact is critical for powerful, consistent contact.

- 7. The Poll will be conducted for 5 consecutive weeks, ballots to be sent on April 16, 23, 30 and May 7, 14. Voting begins at Noon-Thursday, and ends Midnight -Saturday
- 8. Poll results will be submitted to our website at www.ohsbca.org_beginning April 20.
- 9. Coaches selected to vote will receive information on the voting procedures during the last week in March. If you are listed as a voter and have not been contacted by the first week of April, email me so that we may correct the problem
- 10. A sixth ballot, beginning May 21st and Ending Sunday, May 24th will be the All-State, Coaches Poll Team Ballot.


