Chronic Pain Management: Improving the Patient's Quality of Life Saturday, March 24, 2012



Course Highlights

This one-day course focuses on the importance of the interdisciplinary approach to chronic pain with an emphasis on the debilitating effect of intractable pain on the patient's quality of life. Special emphasis will be placed on approaching chronic pain as a 'disease' not a 'symptom'.

Course Learning Objectives

Upon conclusion of this program, participants should be able to:

- Assess, diagnose and evaluate patients with a variety of chronic and cancer related pain disorders
- Describe rational utilization of imaging, use of consultants and discern appropriate referral to pain medicine specialist
- Evaluate the legal and regulatory issues surrounding pain practice and narcotic therapy
- Identify and implement strategies for providing patient-centered pain care in a challenging healthcare environment
- Discuss new information on the management of the medically resistant headache
- Evaluate new information on the management of cancer pain and the intraspinal drug delivery systems

Intended Audience

This course is intended for practicing physicians in primary care, oncology, palliative medicine, neurology, physical medicine and rehabilitation, rheumatologists, neurologists, physician assistants, advanced practice nurses and other health care providers who care for the chronic pain patient.

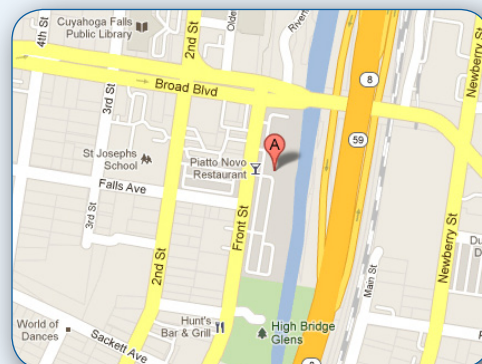
