

A Call to Pharmacists: Promote Your Profession!

One of the most exciting opportunities in the healthcare field is the opportunity to interact directly with the patient and to make a lasting impact. In many settings, the pharmacist is the most approachable healthcare professional for a patient. Despite all of this, many patients and healthcare professionals don't know all of the opportunities provided by their local pharmacists!

There are many things you, as the pharmacist, can do to help educate the public about the services provided in your pharmacy. In order to spread the word, get in the mindset of seeing every encounter as an opportunity to promote your services and profession. During these times you can highlight any number of things.

You may emphasize that pharmacists are always accessible by phone to answer questions about medications, devices, etc. Spread the word about "Drug Take Back" days. Tell them about Medication Therapy Management services that can reconcile patients' drugs with their disease states. With hard work and creativity you will find the sky's the limit for the impact you can have in the lives of your patients.

When speaking with other healthcare professionals, you have a unique opportunity to advertise yourself. Many don't fully understand what the pharmacy can do to help them treat their patients. Let them know your pharmacy can administer vaccinations for patients without an appointment. Also tell them about health screenings performed in your pharmacy. Many physician offices are overbooked with appointments and these screenings could

help free up valuable time. In all your conversations, seek to emphasize the positive parts of your relationship with other healthcare professionals. Pharmacists are integral players in the healthcare community and do their part to impact their patients' lives. As the current healthcare picture continues to evolve, pharmacists' roles are changing to match the needs of patients across the country. It is important that everyone in pharmacy works to educate the public that pharmacists are important members of the healthcare team.

These programs include a look at pain management in compounding pharmacy, transitioning ownership of a pharmacy, and how to open a pharmacy. Most recently, the Center for Entrepreneurship hosted a programming focusing on management, hiring, conflict management, and performance feedback skills which are critical for a successful business.

The Center for Entrepreneurship has

also provided numerous networking opportunities for pharmacists and student pharmacists. The Women in Pharmacy event, in conjunction with Cardinal Health's Women in Pharmacy, gives student pharmacists the chance to learn more about pharmacy ownership and networking with women who currently own in Ohio.


In addition to its programming, the Center has also been developing new resources for pharmacists. The How to Open a Pharmacy Manual includes more than 200 pages on the legal and regulatory requirements for the formation of a new store in Ohio. As the only Ohio-specific handbook, it is an invaluable resource for pharmacists interested in owning.


