



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Study Area: Dayton Conference

Benchmark: Southern Ohio Synod



Population

- The population in this area is estimated to change from 947,770 to 936,134, resulting in a decline of -1.2% between the year 2000 and the current year. Over the next five years, the population is projected to decline by -1.1%.

The Population in Southern Ohio Synod is estimated to change from 5,314,839 to 5,520,968, resulting in a growth of 3.9% between 2000 and the current year. Over the next five years, the population is expected to grow by 2.1%

- The current year median age for this population is 38.4, and the average age is 38.6. Five years from now, the median age is projected to be 39.0.

The current year median age for Southern Ohio Synod is 36.8, while the average age is 37.4. Five years from now, the median age is projected to be 37.7

- Of this area's current year population:
82.8% are White alone, 13.2% are Black or African American alone, 0.2% are American Indian or Alaska Native alone, 1.5% are Asian alone, 0.0% are Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander alone, 0.5% are Some Other Race, and 1.7% are Two or More Races

For Southern Ohio Synod:
83.6% are White alone, 11.8% are Black or African American alone, 0.3% are American Indian or Alaska Native alone, 1.9% are Asian alone, 0.0% are Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander alone, 0.7% are Some Other Race, and 1.7% are Two or More Races

- This area's current estimated Hispanic or Latino population is 1.5%, while Southern Ohio Synod current estimated Hispanic or Latino population is 1.9% .



Households

- The number of households in this area is estimated to change from 376,408 to 380,617, resulting in an increase of 1.1% between 2000 and the current year. Over the next five years, the number is expected to increase by 0.5%.

The number of households in Southern Ohio Synod is estimated to change from 2,082,335 to 2,197,358, resulting in an increase of 5.5% between 2000 and the current year. Over the next five years, the number is projected to increase by 3.1%.



Household Income

- The average household income is estimated to be \$59,547 for the current year, while the average household income for Southern Ohio Synod is estimated to be \$62,420

for the same time frame

The average household income in this area is projected to increase 7.7% over the next five years, from \$59,547 to \$64,143. Southern Ohio Synod is projected to have a 9.8% increase in average household income.

- The current year estimated per capita income for this area is \$24,526, compared to an estimate of \$25,109 for Southern Ohio Synod as a whole.



Employment

- For this area, 79.3% of the population is estimated to be age 16 and over for the current year. The employment status of this labor force is as follows: 0.7% are in the armed forces, 61.9% are employed civilians, 3.1% are unemployed civilians, 34.3% are not in the labor force.

For Southern Ohio Synod, 78.5% of the population is estimated to be age 16 and over for the current year. Of this labor force: 0.2% are in the Armed Forces, 62.8% are employed civilians, 3.1% are unemployed civilians, and 34.0% are not in the labor force.

- For this area, 49.1% of the population is estimated to be employed and age 16 and over for the current year. The occupational classifications are as follows: 27.1% have occupation type blue collar, 58.0% are white collar, and 15.0% are service & farm workers.

For Southern Ohio Synod, 49.3% of the population is estimated to be employed and age 16 and over for the current year. The occupational classifications are as follows: 25.4% have occupation type blue collar, 59.8% are white collar, and 14.8% are service & farm workers.

- For the civilian employed population age 16 and over in this area, it is estimated that they are employed in the following occupational categories: 12.8% are in "Management, Business and Financial Operations", 20.0% are in "Professional and Related Occupations", 14.1% are in "Service", and 25.7% are in "Sales and Office". 0.3% are in "Farming, Forestry and Fishing", 8.1% are in "Construction, Extraction, and Maintenance", and 19.0% are in "Production, Transportation, and Material Moving".

For the civilian employed population age 16 and over in Southern Ohio Synod, it is estimated that they are employed in the following occupational categories: 13.6% are in "Management, Business and Financial Operations", 19.8% are in "Professional and Related Occupations", 14.1% are in "Service", and 26.9% are in "Sales and Office".

0.3% are in "Farming, Forestry and Fishing", 8.6% are in "Construction, Extraction, and Maintenance", and 16.7% are in "Production, Transportation, and Material Moving".



Educational Attainment

- Currently, it is estimated that 8.4% of the population over 25 in this area had earned a Masters. Professional, or Doctorate Degree and 13.5% had earned a Bachelor's Degree.

In comparison, for Southern Ohio Synod, it is estimated that 8.1% of the population over 25 in this area had earned a Masters. Professional, or Doctorate Degree and 15.2% had earned a Bachelor's Degree.



Dwellings

- Most of the dwellings (68.4%) in this area are estimated to be Owner Occupied for the current year. For the entire country, the majority of housing units are Owner Occupied.
- The majority of dwellings in this area (70.3%) are estimated to be "detached single units" for the current year. In Southern Ohio Synod, the majority of dwellings are estimated to be "detached single units".
- The majority of housing units in this area (16.9%) are estimated to have been built in 1939 or Earlier for the current year. Most of the housing units in Southern Ohio Synod (16.9%) are estimated to have been built in 1939 or Earlier for the current year.
