ACEC Ohio, a Year in Review

It is my honor to share with you the 2024–2025 State of the Association for ACEC Ohio, a year defined by strategic progress, robust advocacy, and deepened member engagement. Together, we have strengthened our role as a powerful voice for Ohio's engineering companies and demonstrated our collective impact across the state and beyond.

Organizational Engagement & Leadership

- This year, we convened **4 board meetings**, engaged with **41 active committee meetings**, held **19 chapter meetings**, and facilitated **4 agency liaison sessions**, ensuring strong communication and responsiveness to both our members and public partners.
- Our **7 professional forums**, including those held jointly with ACEC Indiana, covered HR, Finance, IT, and Private Sector priorities. We also convened CEO and marketing-specific forums for enhanced peer dialogue.

Leadership Development & Recognition

- We proudly graduated the **6th class of Rising Leaders**, continuing our investment in emerging talent. We also hosted a continuing education session on "Conflict Resolution" session for all our RL graduates followed by a social event.
- Scholarship support included **4 regional scholarships**, one for CIWP, and a new **Early Career Scholarship** allowing a recipient to attend the ACEC National Spring Convention.
- Our Young Professional and Early Career events were hosted in every chapter, demonstrating our commitment to developing the next generation of industry leaders.

Advocacy & Public Policy

- We successfully conducted our **second annual Regional Legislative Fly-ins** hosting 13 Ohio Legislative Members across 4 chapters.
- Continuing to build strategic relationships through the PAC kick-off event, Ohio House and Senate Leadership Dinners and targeted political contributions. For the **ninth consecutive year**, ACEC Ohio met our ACEC PAC fundraising goal.
- Key advocacy issues addressed so far this year in Ohio include:
 - **OPWC reauthorization**
 - **ODOT budget**
 - General Revenue Fund budget
 - Opposition to harmful non-compete clause legislation
- At the national level, **10 of Ohio's U.S. House members and both U.S. Senators** participated in our DC Fly-in and ACEC Annual Meeting visits.
- Developed an "Advocacy 101" podcast to amplify our message and engage members in legislative efforts.

Programs & Member Services

- Business education remained central with:
 - The **PSMJ Principal Bootcamp**
 - AI & Insurance and Workforce Development Roadshow webinars
 - Our continued **Professional Forum series**
 - A Virtual Ethics session
- We conducted a **comprehensive salary**, **benefits**, **and business practices survey** with participation from 43 firms.
- Our **Engineering Excellence Awards** received 23 project submissions and brought in over 200 attendees. The event received media coverage in Columbus and advanced 3 projects to ACEC National.
- We've continued to support members with **QBS guidance**, including a presentation at the CEAO conference, resulting in several successful qualification-based selections.

Strategic Initiatives & Industry Collaboration

- The Board addressed several key initiatives:
 - Finalized and approved our strategic plan
 - Created a **non-resident member category** and updated our bylaws accordingly
 - Approved the Early Career Scholarship using excess chapter funds
 - Provided financial and advocacy support for OPWC Issue 2
- Ongoing collaboration with **OFCC** resulted in shared work on contract revisions and an IPD panel discussion.
- We are engaged in dual platform and fee guidance issues with ODOT and are revamping our Energy and Environment Committee.
- We've created liaisons for workforce development with the Lt. Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation, OSU, and Strategic Ohio Council of Higher Ed (SOCHE) to support pipeline growth. These liaisons are in addition to the Educational Service Center, NAWIC Block Kids, Future Cities and The Ohio Science Academy.

Member Engagement

- We continue to engage with ACEC's DEI initiatives and were proud to co-host our first **"Women in Leadership" seminar** with WTS and NAWIC in early June.
- Membership has expanded with 7 new firms, 2 non-resident firms, and 6 new affiliates.
- Our work with **DBE firms** included engagement on injunction-related issues and collaboration with ODOT on an SBE pilot program.

As we look to the future, ACEC Ohio remains focused on:

- Supporting members through economic and inflationary uncertainty
- Helping firms navigate the impacts of AI and digital delivery
- Securing infrastructure funding and monitoring its effective implementation

- Advocating for **tax policies** that protect our industry's sustainability
- Strengthening recruitment and retention in the face of continued M&A activity

Action Items (Year to Date)

In Progress

- Plan Quality Discussion ODOT met with 5-6 contractors in the second half of 2024 and utilized a peer exchange format to better understand the challenges of both the Department and Contractors. There was discussion regarding items that were causing contractors to add risk to their bid prices. Contractors indicated that in some instances the lack of detail being provided in answers to Prebid Question results in them having to add risk to their price. Contractors also cited incidents where lack of quality (and clarity) in the plans is driving up their bids. ODOT indicated that Significant Plan Quality issues will be reflected in design consultants CES scores. A joint committee will be established in 2025 (ODOT/ACEC OH/OCA) as there are many issues in getting plans complete including scope, review timeframes and specs. This was further discussed during breakout sessions at the 2025 ODOT ACEC Ohio Partnership Conference and will be a topic further explored this year.
- Federal Executive Orders Update Impact on ODOT
 - o ODOT received a low carbon grant (equipment purchase) that is on hold
 - Additional grants including RAISE, etc. are also on hold
 - o No further updates on other Energy or Equity impacts at this time
 - ODOT NEVI formula state plan will be resubmitted this fall; currently no state NEVI plans are approved
 - o States are requesting more formula-based funding solutions versus grant programs

Completed

- a. **2025 ODOT ACEC Ohio Partnering Conference** Over 350 attendees participated in this year's conference with a theme of "Quality Matters". Several breakout sessions were structured to better understand the state of quality as experienced by contractors, consultants, and ODOT. Takeaways from the conference will be used by the Transportation Liaison Committee to determine next steps later this year.
- b. Dual Platform (Autodesk/Bentley) Discussion : ACEC Ohio was approached by representatives from Autodesk regarding potential industry interest in developing a state kit tailored for use in Ohio. ACEC Ohio shared this inquiry with its member firms and received mixed

feedback. Several smaller consultant firms expressed limited interest, citing that their delivery teams are already proficient in and primarily use the existing Bentley platform. Notably, some ACEC Ohio member firms have expressed willingness to assist Autodesk in creating a state kit if a path forward were established.

ODOT had previously been contacted by Autodesk and was aware of their interest. However, ODOT currently lacks the internal resources to support or maintain a state kit should one be developed by Autodesk. This topic was discussed in person between ODOT and an ACEC Ohio subcommittee on March 3, 2025. While ODOT does not mandate a specific software platform only that submitted plans meet all applicable design requirements—it has invested in the development and ongoing maintenance of the Bentley OpenRoads Designer (ORD) state kit. Given the time and cost involved, ODOT has no current plans to support a dual-platform environment.

- c. **Consultant Prequalification Updates** ODOT rolled out new prequalification requirements in July of 24. Several updates required additional training above and beyond what has historically been required. ODOT also added new hydraulic and hydrologic (H&H) requirements to the bridge prequalification. The transportation consultant community voiced their concern with these changes and a committee (with representation from ODOT and the consultant community) was formed to reevaluate the recent prequalification updates. Summary of findings/recommendations:
 - Number of years for representative projects was discussed, and proposal was made to allow projects performed within last 8-10 years.
 - ODOT is working to find ways to increase the frequency of NHI courses being offered. Also working to establish their own equivalent training courses – doing so requires approval by FHWA Ohio Division.
 - ODOT also collaborating with other MAASTO states on things they are doing to get FHWA approved courses in place.
 - o Advanced Hydraulics will be a new prequalification category
 - Federal requirements driving these changes
 - Any changes that are ultimately decided will be reflected by published updates to the Prequalification Manual and notice of those changes will be shared via ODOT's Consultant Announcement system.
 - ODOT acknowledged that the PreQ system currently generates automated emails which have led to confusion and is working to revise the wording in those messages to provide clarity.
 - When a DBE or EDGE firm loses their certification, they will need to remove the certification from their firm profile within the PreQ system within 30 days. Important that all consultants understand that the DBE report generated from the Consultant Services web site is reliant on the info that each firm has entered into PreQ. Best practice would be to always confirm with planned DBE partners that their certification is still in place.
- d. **Streamlined Programmatic General Qualifications (GQ)** The Letter of Interest (LOI) subcommittee identified a way to streamline the GQ submitted with each programmatic. Instead of it being a 7-page document, a single page GQ will be developed for each specific KSPA. This pilot was rolled out in the January Programmatic.
 - i. Positive responses from Districts; like shortened prequal summary
 - ii. No issues to report; will continue outreach and provide updates when available

e. **DBE Program and Injunction**– ODOT completed a study to investigate any discrepancies in overall DBE participation on projects whether the project included a DBE Participation Goal or a DBE Development Goal. Based on the data they reviewed ODOT feels they are getting similar overall DBE participation regardless of whether the project has a DBE Participation Goal or DBE Development Goal. ACEC Ohio continues to be in contact with ODOT on the *DBE Program Federal court decision in Kentucky (Mid-America Milling Company, LLC, et. Al. v. U.S. Department of Transportation, et. al.).* At this time, it's business as usual for the consultant DBE program.

f. Biennial State Budget

- i. ODOT \$11 billion budget passed Ohio General Assembly and goes into effect July 1, 2025.
- ii. Revenue projections are good through the TRAC
 - 1. After 2 years, there is a likely funding gap
 - a. 2028 anticipated shortfalls are between \$150-200M
 - 2. Plan to have a TRAC round in May with a realistic outlook on what funding is available for these projects
 - 3. Current TRAC list includes \$4.3B in unfunded projects

- Continued dialog with ODOT on plan quality and delivering the program and stresses / impacts caused by labor shortage, etc.
