Public Health Infrastructure Grant



Total funding for health departments (not including data modernization).



\$3,000,000,000

Funding for all **health departments** to recruit, retain, support, and train the public health workforce.




\$140,000,000

Funding for all **health departments** to strengthen systems, processes, and policies.


Public Health Transformation Defined

Public health transformation requires reimagining and developing a common vision to ensure the mindsets, capacity, resources, and workforce necessary to provide equitable Foundational Public Health Services and Essential Public Health Services, to advance health, wellbeing, and equity.

It occurs through a fundamental shift in the way a public health system(s) is structured, functions and interacts through continuous quality improvement, innovation, partnerships, community-led efforts, and systems change.

Assess and Cost


Assess and cost current FPHS implementation and gap in funding to achieve full implementation. Conduct other assessments as needed.

Pursue Funding

Pursue sustainable funding for public health infrastructure.

Test and Transform

Test, modernize, and transform system and services; practices and innovations in workforce, data, service sharing, etc.






