




Monthly change in number of employed persons

Did involuntary psychiatric admissions increase among Black Americans during the 2008 recession?


Decline in number of employed persons



Increase in involuntary psychiatric admissions among Black Males

- 3% increase per unit decline in monthly employment change
- 995 additional commitments among Black males over study period
- No statistical detection among other race/sex categories
