# **Investing in Brownfields**

► To Build a Greater Ohio...

Fund the Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund

Nearly \$40 million in funding available through the reallocation of liquor profits the state receives each year from JobsOhio



# **Investing in Brownfields**



#### Results

 Legislature Enacts Ohio Brownfield Remediation Fund & Commercial & Residential Demolition Fund
\$350 Million Allocation for Brownfield Program
\$150 Million Allocation for Demolition Program

Both programs represent one-time allocations that will need to be fully appropriated in 24 months

# **Innovate Infrastructure & Transportation**

#### ► To Build a Greater Ohio...

- Maintain Support for Public Transit
  - Transit has been a vital service throughout the coronavirus pandemic

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Retain \$70 million approved in funding two years ago to maintain this necessary service

# **Innovate Infrastructure & Transportation**

#### Results

Public Transit Funding Retained at Historic Level of 2 years ago

- \$37 million in GRF Funding along with \$33 million in federal "flex funding" made available for public transit
- \$70 million in combined funding 10 times what was proposed by the DeWine Administration

# Innovate Infrastructure & Transportation

**To Build a Greater Ohio...** 

Invest in Broadband Infrastructure

Lack of access is a problem in both rural communities and marginalized neighborhoods in our urban cores

# Innovate Infrastructure & Transportation



- GOPC was proud to lend our voice to the chorus of groups advocating for the Ohio Residential Broadband Expansion Grant Program
  - \$250 million in grants to internet service providers for construction of broadband projects that improve high-speed internet access in underserved and unserved areas of Ohio.

# **Empower Ohio's Legacy Cities**

► To Build a Greater Ohio...

- Preserve Long-Term City Investments
  - Suspension of the Commuter Tax was a necessary response to the coronavirus pandemic
  - Lifting the suspension could negatively impact Ohio cities by as much as \$411 million per year



# **Empower Ohio's Legacy Cities**



#### Results

- Commuter Tax suspension remains in effect for the remainder of tax year 2021 (12/31/21)
  - Individual taxpayers can claim a refund for taxes paid in 2021 to a city they did not work in (not automatically issued)
  - Prevented an effort to extend this refund for taxes paid in 2020
  - Delay permits cities time to adjust budgets for 2022 and beyond

# **Ongoing Priorities**

- Protect Ohio Families Through Stable Housing
- Stabilize Our Downtown & Commercial Centers
- Prevent New Cycles of Blight & Disinvestment in Residential Neighborhoods

- Invest in Placemaking Programs to Capitalize on Community Assets
- Ensure Capacity Building is Part of All State Programs



# 2023-2024 Public Policy Platform

#### Reflect & Refocus: Furthering Resilient Communities

- Success of efforts around brownfields & public transit priorities will result in shift of GOPC's policy priorities in 2023 and beyond
  - Impact of pandemic has shifted the timeline for our agenda
  - Goal is to have new agenda in place and released in August/September of 2022 (or before)
