If Only Every Monday Could Be Spent Playing Golf: With fortune shining down in the form of temperatures below 95 degrees, the annual BX Dayton golf outing occurred on Monday July 25th. Much to my chagrin, I learned what I already knew, that I am a hack golfer, but had a wonderful time nonetheless.

Changes to Public Bidding: Significant changes to how contracts for public projects are awarded were placed in the recently-passed state budget bill. New law now allows, among other things, the public use of qualification-based Construction Manager at Risk and Design-Build award methods. We anticipate that the use of these new systems will change how and when we are able to report on public work, since public bidding and awards will no longer take place in the same manner they have for the last hundred years or so. So depending on how many public entities choose to use these new systems, much or very little could change in our reporting services. The BX is on top of these changes and will be working closely with state, county, and local governments along with their construction managers and design-build contractors to provide our members with information on public bidding opportunities. You can be sure that even in this ever-changing environment that we will strive, as always, to provide you the information you need to bid work in Dayton and beyond.

New Sign In Policy Anyone entering the planroom must now sign in in the plan office before entering the planroom. Though this may seem like an inconvenience, this was done for two reasons. The first was to eliminate the problem of documents walking out of the planroom never to return. It was very frustrating for most members who abide by this rule to try and locate an addendum on a project only to find that it had gone missing. Secondly, this rule was adopted to make sure the people using the planroom are paying members. We appreciate that our members thought enough to invest dues money in our service and want to ensure that everyone in the planroom is a paying member.

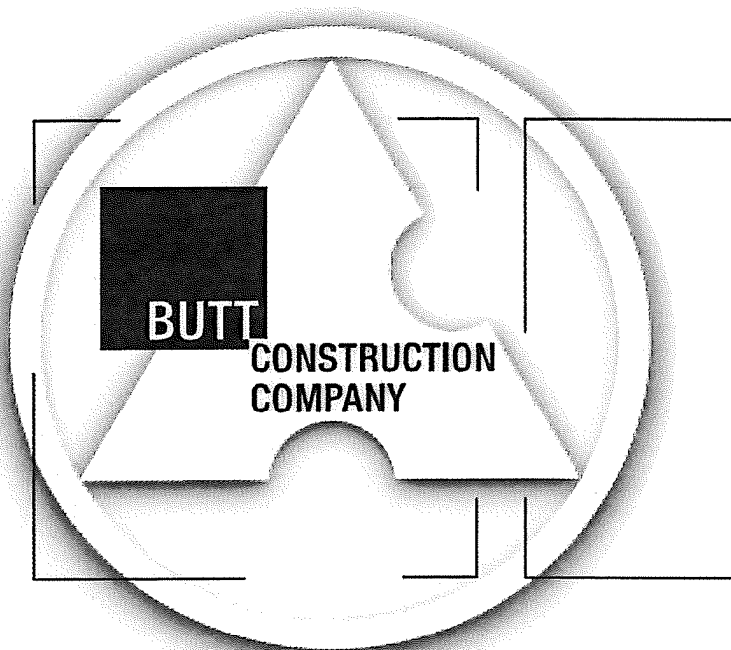

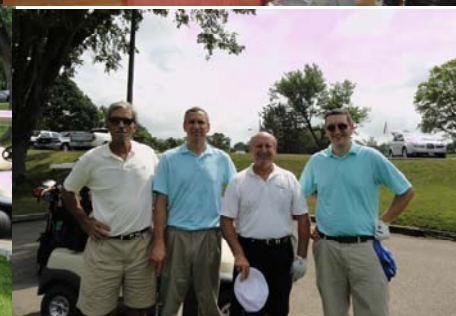

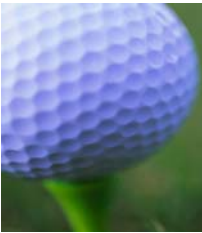

RE: Group-Rating Safety Accountability

Dear Employer:

Each year Ohio employers have the opportunity to participate in BWC's Group-Experience-Rating Program or Group-Retrospective-Rating Program. While these programs are not required, they do provide you with an opportunity to significantly reduce your workers' compensation premiums, while increasing your awareness of safety and risk-management strategies.

Workplace safety is an important component of these programs. To succeed in accident prevention, we encourage you to use the many resources available to you. We believe a group-rating program is a partnership that includes you and your employees, your sponsoring organization or third-party administrator (TPA) and BWC. Each has specific roles and responsibilities, all designed to assist in preventing workplace accidents. This letter outlines the safety services expectations you should have as an employer enrolled in a group-rating program.

The employer will:

- Maintain a safe workplace;
- Attend safety training to enhance workplace safety;
- Implement BWC's 10-Step Business Plan for Safety and use available safety services as needed;
- Attend the required two-hour training and provide proof of attendance to sponsor for claim(s) occurring within the last two years.

The certified primary and affiliated sponsoring organizations will:

- Communicate, educate and verify BWC's 10-Step Business Plan for Safety to group members;
- Sponsor eight hours of safety training (this may be done at one time or may be provided incrementally as long as the total is at least eight hours);
- Provide information regarding safety resources to group members;
- Possibly assist an employer in achieving its safety needs;
- Manage employer fulfillment of the two-hour training requirement, where applicable;
- Publish this letter to group members.

The TPA may:

- Assist sponsoring organizations with fulfilling the group-rating safety requirements;
- Assist an employer with its safety needs;
- Work in conjunction with sponsors to develop safety training and deliver safety resources;
- Provide resources for claims handling.

BWC will:

- Monitor all group-rating safety activities to confirm requirements are met;
- Meet at least annually with sponsoring organizations to provide recommendations for fulfilling safety requirements;
- Provide safety training through Ohio's Center for Occupational Safety & Health;
- Offer on-site safety consultation (hazard assessments, air and noise monitoring, ergonomics evaluation, training) by a BWC safety professional;
- Offer publications and videos for safety program support;
- Conduct employer visits to confirm the employer is meeting group-rating requirements, when appropriate.

The goal of this collaborative effort is to make sure all your safety needs are met. Using these resources will assist you in preventing accidents, reducing claims costs and achieving the highest discounts possible. Below you'll find contact information for various resources.

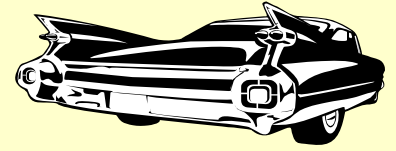

WHAT TO DO IN CASE OF AN OSHA INSPECTION

OSHA will be stepping up the number of OSHA Inspections that they will be conducting during the coming year. They have a number of initiatives that will be getting attention that could result in your company being inspected:

- * High DART Rate.
- * The DART Rate is the number of days away from work cases and the number of days of transitional duty cases combined. If your company's DART Rate is higher than NAICS Code 32732 - 4.9 cases with days away from work, job transfer or restriction, your company will be on the Inspection List.
- * OSHA is also still visiting companies under the Silica Initiative and the Concrete Industry has been listed under the Amputation Initiative.

Therefore, it is important to know what to do in case OSHA pays you a visit. Have a Plan and a designated contact person, listen to what they ask and respond accordingly and do not provide extra information unless you believe it will help. Remember they are there to find violations not to put you on the list.

Before an inspection the following should be in place:

- * Make sure all written programs are up to date.
- * Make sure all required training is conducted and documented.
- * Conduct routine inspections and correct any problem areas.
- * Make sure employees are following company safety policies.

During Inspection:

- * Be polite.
- * Check the identification of the Inspector.
- * Find out why they are there.
- * Review the scope of the inspection.
- * Provide the requested information (check over to make sure it is up to date).
- * Document everything OSHA requests. If documents are not available, advise the Inspector then send it to him once it is located.
- * Stay with the Inspector during the Inspection.
- * Take a Photo of everything they take a picture of.
- * If it is an employee complaint, take them to the area of the complaint then back to the office.
- * Correct any minor problems immediately.
- * If requested make a place available for the Inspector to interview employees.
- * At the Closing Conference find out what items the Inspector plans to cite.
- * Discuss the Abatement Period.
- * Request an Informal Conference once the Citation arrives.
- * Date stamp the Citations when they arrive.
- * Post Citations until all items have been corrected (minimum of 3 days if all items have all ready been corrected).
- * Attend the Informal Conference, most are scheduled within 15 days.
- * Bring evidence of actions taken to correct the violations.
- * Request additional Abatement time if necessary.
- * Request additional reductions in penalties.
- * If acceptable, sign the Agreement.
- * Pay any fine within 21 days.
- * If needed, hire an Attorney to help.
- * I recommend the following:
 - * Serious Injuries or Deaths
 - * Serious Violations or Fines
 - * Appeal if necessary.

Remember you are guilty until you can prove your innocence at the Informal Conference. Once you appeal, the burden switches back to OSHA to prove you were in violation.

The best defense in case of an OSHA Inspection is knowledge. Know what to do before an inspection, know what to do during an inspection and know what your rights are after an inspection.

Rectangular Industrial Duct Construction Standard Now ANSI Accredited

SMACNA's "[Rectangular Industrial Duct Construction Standard, \(Inch Pound\) 2nd edition, 2004](#)," was recently accredited as American National Standard (ANSI). The standard is intended for use by contractors, fabricators and designers of air pollution control, pneumatic conveyance and industrial ventilation systems. It covers the simple, low or moderate temperature and pressure (or vacuum) indoor systems as well as the more complex outdoor systems that operate at moderate to high temperature and pressure (or vacuum), and are subject to higher and more complex external loading.

Included in the standard are:

- Six types of carbon galvanized and aluminized steels
- Seven types of stainless steel alloys
- Three types of aluminum alloys
- Consideration of wind, snow, ice, and other loads
- Design check for localized and global modes of side panel buckling
- Design capability for high temperature systems up to 800°F, and higher with design review by a specialized professional
- Practical examples with step-by-step instructions
- Guidance for designing air systems conveying corrosives and abrasives.
- Guide Specification for the fabrication and installation of industrial duct systems
- Welding specifications

The manual is based on generations of first hand experience from SMACNA's industrial contractors, physical testing, finite element analysis studies, and design guidance related to the issue of nonlinear elastic buckling of duct side panels on rectangular industrial duct.

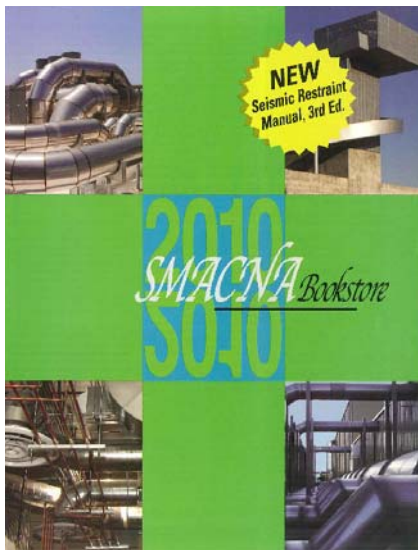
