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#### Administrative: OFCC Indoor Air Quality Assistance Program

The Ohio Facilities Construction Commission provided financial assistance to hundreds of schools for COVID-19 renovations to HVAC systems, through its Indoor Air Quality Assistance Program. (Cont'd page 2.)

## Administrative: ODOT Priority Projects

The Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC) approved its annual priority funding list for funding design and construction of Ohio highways over the next 4 years, budgeting in excess of \$292 million in new spending. (Cont'd p. 2.)

#### Administrative: OCILB Enforcement

In August, the separate trades sections of the Ohio Construction Industry Licensing Board approved contractors to test, approved reciprocity applications with other states, and cited unlicensed contracting activity in its continuing effort to enforce the law. (Cont'd p. 2.)

#### Administrative: OFCC Design Professional Selection

The Ohio Facilities Construction Commission is seeking statements of qualifications for Design Professionals, due in September, leading to significant construction projects for contractors to bid after design at Ohio colleges and universities. (Cont'd p. 2.)

## Administrative: Ohio Controlling Board

#### **Approves Unbid Construction Work**

Every two weeks, the Ohio Controlling Board approves release of public capital funds for state agencies, colleges, and universities, for unbid design professional contracts and unbid construction projects. (Cont'd p. 3.)

#### Administrative: Meet OBBS

The Ohio Board of Building Standards is responsible for promulgating and enforcing Ohio's Commercial and Residential Building Codes, subject to appeal to the Board of Building Appeals. (Cont'd p. 3.)

#### Legislative: Bills Await General Assembly Return

The House and Senate are scheduled to resume committee hearings and one-daya-week floor sessions beginning in September through year-end. While we might see activity, traditionally legislators remain home for local campaigning and private work until the first of the year. (Cont'd p. 4.)

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#### Administrative: OFCC Indoor Air Quality Assistance Program (Cont'd)

Energy project managers reported to OFCC on Thursday, August 19, 2021 that ventilation and filtration strategies help reduce transmission of the virus, issuing a whitepaper with guidelines prepared for the Ohio Department of Education.

IAQ Assistance Program funding is available through October 15, 2021.

Separately, the OFCC Executive Director reported general contract activity of \$151 million for 90 schools, with Fiscal Year 2021 through June totaling \$2.2 billion for 69 designs and 179 construction projects.

#### Administrative: ODOT Priority Projects

The final TRAC vote is scheduled for September 22, 2021 after considering public comments.

Supplementing highway funding sources will be \$206 million in federal COVID-19 Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations.

Funding primarily will go to Ohio's major metropolitan areas for large projects.

The TRAC members are appointed by the Governor by Ohio geographical region, with two members appointed by the House Speaker and Senate President. For further information, see:

#### Administrative: OCILB Enforcement (Cont'd)

On August 4, the Electrical Section met and approved 37 contractors to take the licensure test; approved 11 licenses from 4 different states based on reciprocity; and denied testing to 3 applicants.

On August 11, the Plumbing-Hydronics Section met and approved 23 contractors to take the licensure test; approved 2 licenses from West Virginia based on reciprocity; and fined a licensed plumbing contractor \$1,000.00 for using its license for an unlicensed contractor.

On August 18, the HVAC-Refrigeration Section met and approved 17 contractors to take the licensure test; approved 2 licenses from 2 different states based on reciprocity; and fined a nonlicensed contractor \$1,000.00 for refrigeration work without a license.

On August 25, the Administrative Section met and approved issuance of 1,733 various trades licenses in June and July. The Board Secretary reported collecting \$3,000.00 in fines since April.

#### <u>Administrative</u>: OFCC Design Professional Selection (Cont'd)

As with federal construction, Ohio Revised Code 153.65 et seq. requires public agencies to rank Design Professionals by qualifications, excluding any request for a price proposal. The public authority enjoys broad discretion to define criteria to determine who is most qualified.

9-9-21 Cleveland State U Dining Facilities Estimate: \$8.6 million

#### Administrative: Ohio Controlling Board Approves Unbid Construction Work (Cont'd)

On August 30, 2021, the Controlling Board will consider award of \$4.3 million to design professionals, and \$16.8 million to construction contractors including Construction Managers at Risk.

Because these projects are not competitively bid, construction contractors may not be aware of such awards every two weeks throughout the year, and covering all agencies, colleges, and universities.

Awards for design foreshadow construction work to come, and awards for CM's at Risk present opportunities for Specialty Trades Contractors for subcontracting.

In theory, Controlling Board members are considering whether the legislative intent of the fiscal appropriation is being met, and not diverting capital funds to an unintended project.

The Controlling Board is chaired by a President appointed by the Director of the Office of Budget and Management, which hosts the internet site. The House and Senate Chairs of each Finance Committee also serve as members, along with two members from each chamber of different parties.

> To require owners of private construction projects to timely pay a contractor. 5/26/2021 - Referred to Committee Senate Workforce and Higher Education 5/19/2021 - Passed By House; Vote 86-11

HB 88 <u>Require License For Commercial</u> <u>Roofing Contractors</u> (Patton T)

## SB 64 Regulate Roofing Contractors

To require the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency to conduct a study to determine where brownfield sites are located in this state and to make an appropriation.


