Dr. Colleen Shogan

Dr. Colleen Shogan is a Senior Vice President at the White House Historical Association and the Director of the David Rubenstein National Center for White House History. Previously, she worked for over a decade as a senior executive at the Library of Congress. She served recently as the Vice-Chair of the Women's Suffrage Centennial Commission. Her areas of research include presidential leadership, presidential rhetoric, and women in politics. She teaches a graduate course at Georgetown University in the Government Department focused on the intersection of politics and American history. Colleen received her B.A. from Boston College and her Ph.D. in Political Science from Yale University. She is a member of Phi Beta Kappa and a former graduate fellow with the National Science Foundation. In her spare time, she writes an award-winning mystery novel series set in Washington, D.C.

Dr. Barbara Perry

Barbara A. Perry is the Gerald L. Baliles Professor and director of presidential studies at the University of Virginia's Miller Center, where she co-directs the Presidential Oral History Program. She has authored or edited 16 books on presidents, First Ladies, the Kennedy family, the Supreme Court, and civil rights and civil liberties. She co-directs the Hillary Rodham Clinton Oral History Project. She served as a U.S. Supreme Court fellow and has worked for both Republican and Democratic members of the Senate.

Her books include *42: Inside the Presidency of Bill Clinton* (edited with Michael Nelson and Russell Riley); *41: Inside the Presidency of George H.W. Bush* (edited with Michael Nelson); *Rose Kennedy: The Life and Times of a Political Matriarch* and *Jacqueline Kennedy: First Lady of the New Frontier*, among other works.

Perry is a frequent media commentator for national and international news sources such as CBS, PBS, CNN, C-SPAN, MSNBC, NPR, PRI, Fox News, BBC, Canadian Broadcasting Corp., Swiss TV, and *HuffPost Live*.
