


The "Boomer Bulge"

- America's 78 million Baby Boomers will began turning 65 at a rate of one every 10 seconds (3 to 4 million per year).
- Over the age of 65, two thirds of Boomers are expected to have **5 or more chronic diseases**, see 15 different physicians and average over 40 doctor visits a year.

SCRIPPS Ohio's 60+ Projected Population by County



Residential Options for Older Adults

Independent Living

- Housing & Urban Development Apts (subsidized)
- Low income Housing Tax Credit Apts (rent controlled)
- Middle Market Apts
- Continuous Care Retirement Communities



Residential Options for Older Adults (cont.)

Assisted Living (person cannot live alone)

- Private Pay (Rent dependent upon care provided)
- Medicaid (Assisted Living Waiver)



Residential Options for Older Adults (cont.)

Skilled Nursing/Rehabilitation (regular nursing)

- Short-term stay (Follows a hospitalization)
- Long-Term stay (Medicaid, LTC Policy or Private Pay)



Residential Options for Older Adults (cont.)

- Continuing Care Retirement Community
 - Two or more care options to transition too
- Independent Living
 - Entrance Fee
 - Monthly Rental
- Assisted Living/ Memory Care
 - Private Pay
- Nursing Home
