Incident Response and Investigation Immediate Response to Accidents and Injuries

A swift and organized response to accidents and injuries is critical in minimizing harm and preventing further incidents. All personnel, especially linemen, must be well-versed in the procedures for handling emergencies in the field.

Key components of an immediate response plan include:

1. Prompt Reporting

- Any accident, injury, or near-miss must be reported immediately to a supervisor or designated safety officer.
- Accurate and timely reporting allows for proper medical care, investigation, and documentation.

2. Securing the Area

- The incident site must be secured to prevent further injuries or damage.
