2021 Kentucky General Assembly

- Short Session
 - 30 Legislative Days (January March)
- One-Year Budget
- COVID Recovery
- Executive Power Limitations

- HB 140 Telehealth
 - Expands definition of telehealth
 - Remote patient monitoring
 - Audio-only encounters
 - Removes face-to-face restrictions for certain behavioral health services
 PASSED & SIGNED INTO LAW

- SB 5 COVID-19 Liability Protections
 - Provides premises liability protections for public-facing businesses
 - Provides liability protections for "essential service" providers, including physicians and hospitals, from claims "arising from COVID-19"

• PASSED & BECAME LAW WITHOUT GOVERNOR'S SIGNATURE

SB 45 – Co-pay Accumulator

Requires health insurers to count ALL payments for prescription drugs made by patients directly or on their behalf toward their deductibles and overall out-of-pocket maximums
 PASSED & SIGNED INTO LAW

• HB 50 – Mental Health Parity

 Requires insurers to demonstrate compliance with federal law in how they design and apply managed care techniques for behavioral and mental health treatment

○ PASSED & SIGNED INTO LAW



SB 51 – MAT Prior Authorization

 Removes prior authorization requirements by commercial health plans and Medicaid MCOs for FDAapproved medications used to treat alcohol and opioid use disorder
 PASSED & SIGNED INTO LAW
