HOW TO USE AN AAPC CODE CARD

The documents below consist of two pages:

- One is the vendor code card it includes the title, index number, and number of CEUs for each session.
- The second is the attendee code card it has the same information with the exception of the index number.
- Each AAPC member attendee should be given the **attendee code card** prior to the start of the conference.

The index number:

- The index number of a session should be released to the attendees at the close of the approved sessions.
 - The presenter can do this by putting the index number on their last slide or writing it on a white board.
 - It is the responsibility of the attendee to write the index number on their code card and retain the document.

The Member Responsibility:

- The member will enter the index numbers into their AAPC CEU tracker upon completion of the conference.
- The member will need to retain the code card for CEU submission and possible random audit.



For your convenience, the AAPC has approved the sessions for both a core credential and a specialty credential. You may use a specific session for your specialty CEUs or for your core credential CEUs. The use of one session for both specialty and core CEUs is not permitted.
