TOTALS

56 towns (out of 351) do not require a valid local tobacco sales permit before a retailer may sell tobacco products. **292** do require this permit.

50 listed municipalities have populations under 5,000 (2000 US Census) and have few if any tobacco retailers. (indicated by an asterisk *)

3 listed municipalities do not require a tobacco sales permit but do have other youth access components in effect (indicated by bolded text)

Also note, there may be a couple of municipalities that require a permit in their regulation, but do not issue them.
