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## **2-Hour Notifications**

• Release to environment above Reportable Quantity (RQ):

https://eeaonline.eea.state.ma.us/DEP/MOMHL/hazmat.aspx

- Petroleum--10 gallons- gasoline, diesel fuel, waste oil etc.
- Waste Vegetable Oil- 55 gallons
- Transformer Oil or MODF (PCB less than 2 ppm)—25 gallons
- Releases to surface water ("sheen")
- Human health impacts-poses or could pose imminent hazard (IH)—Risk based—Releases to Drinking water and indoor air
- IH concentrations of OHM in surface soil—listed for As, Cd, Cr IV, CN, Hg, Methyl Hg, and PCBs
- Fishkill- attributable to OHM release



# 72-hour Notifications

Including but not limited to:

- Underground Storage Tank (UST) Release- leaks during usage or discovered at time of removal;
- Release to groundwater near public and private water supplies;
- Conditions of Substantial Release Migration;
- Threat of Vapor Intrusion—GW-2 Standards exceeded near occupied residence; school
- Free Phase petroleum (LNAPL) near a sensitive receptor (residence).



## **120-Day Notifications**

- Generally submitted as a result of due diligence: discovery of OHM above applicable reportable concentrations (RCs) for soil and groundwater
- No existing IRA condition, but LSP must continue to evaluate the site for any IRA Conditions (2-hr, 72-hr. notifications)
- PRP submits complete Release Notification Form information sometimes limited
- ER Section processes 120-Day notifications and issues NOR w/cc to BOH - call if any questions



## **Releases Exempt from Notification**

- Passenger vehicle accidents
- Releases "completely" contained in buildings or utility vaults
- Releases from lead paint emanating from original application site
- Release from building materials still in use
- Pesticides applied in accordance with labeling
- Release of propane and some liquified gases- public safety component
- Sheen from "normal" roadway and parking lot runoff
- Releases to sanitary sewer system with exceptions

Exempt does not mean we don't respond!













- Authorized to commit MassDEP resources to address Imminent Hazards and other risk to public health and safety
- Operate under Incident Command System
- Joint response with Fire Departments and State Hazmat Teams
- US EPA and US Coast Guard







#### Joint Response with Fire Department and DFS Hazmat

- Hazmat operates six regional Hazmat teams (Districts) to provide support to local fire department across the Commonwealth with technical information, expertise and specialized equipment.
- Each Regional ER program coordinates with respective Hazmat District





- Hazmat response defined as follows, with Tier 1 being the "lowest" and Tier 5 the "highest" (from DFS website):
  - Tier 1 Hazardous & Risk Assessment suspicious substance, open and loose suspicious powders
  - Tier 2 Short Term Operation Limited release;
  - Tier 3 Long Term Operation Full Team Large Release;
  - Tier 4 Multi District Response Multi-operational period; and
  - Tier 5 WMD/Mass Contamination Full System Response (all District teams).
- Threat of Fire or Explosion MassDEP Role
  - Support and Science role to FD and/or District Hazmat Team
  - Ambient Air Monitoring
  - Modeling Dispersion and Dilution
  - Field reconnaissance
  - Transition to Incident Command once public safety threat eliminated



- Massachusetts Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act
  - Trailers, Geographic Response Strategies (GRS) development, testing and First Responder training
- Incident Preparedness and Planning
  - Area Committees, Regional Response Team
  - Government Industry lead exercise
  - o Outreach
- All Hazards Planning
  - Internal MassDEP planning floods, fires, hurricanes, tornado
  - Local and regional emergency planning committees

#### Recent Fire- Orange Cereal Mill, WERO

- Large building fire- abandoned mill
- Asbestos-containing roofing debris carried with fire thermals over a 2mile downwind area- residential area, open space and surface water
- Building demolished and pile of debris left
- Town-funded and State-funded contractors retained to collect debris and cleanup river debris and initiate initial removal/consolidation
- State-funded contractor retained to cover remaining fire debris
- Town successfully pursued an earmark for complete removal of debris- in planning stages

### **General Guidelines- Dumping Discoveries**

- Handle with common sense, erring on side of caution
- Notify local fire officials ASAP
- Treat each incident as a crime scene, involving local police in investigation
- For "significant" incidents, contact MassDEP
- Determine ownership of property and contact landowner.



#### MassDEP Response

- At request of local public safety officials and/or property owner
- Assist in securing dumping area
- Determine if a criminal investigation is warranted- Local Police and Environmental Crimes Strike Force (ESF)
- Sample and screen materials- field and laboratory testing
- Arrange for disposal utilizing state-funded contractor if landowner unable or unwilling
- Assess to determine if soil and groundwater have been impacted, and coordinate follow-up cleanup
- Coordinate follow-up investigation with law enforcement and/or ESF
- Address recovery of response action costs if possible
