Stakeholder work is a favorite discipline









### WHY LEARN ABOUT SMALL GRANTS

1. Tackle areas beyond statutory needs of the town/city/community

2. Lots more than inspectional/mandated – PH a broad discipline

3. Overall community health needs (community needs assessments) i.e. Education, nutrition, prevention, EQUITY of resources

4. Create partnerships with community stakeholders **5.** Learning exercise for you – build skills to always use 6. Provide \$\$ when the dept. budget is flat and "no"





The planning steps take place to work on issues with the current project and plan others if you wish.

Invite stakeholders to planning meetings to get their valuable input . Tell them they are welcome to come at any time.

Once success, think of other ways to improve the quality of life and fill needs in the community

A good way to keep the whole large stakeholder group in touch is to plan an annual health fair


### **U.S. CENSUS & AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY**

MOST POPULAR SOCIAL, ECONOMIC, HOUSING, AND DEMOGRAPHIC DATA FOR A SINGLE GEOGRAPHIC AREA.

- Economic characteristics & outlook
- 130 different surveys used

**THE NUMBERS you need MAKING AN ARGUMENT** imperfect as they are

- Disability, veteran status, language at home, commuting, income, health insurance coverage
- Computer availability and use, ethnicity, housing















Department of Transitional Assistance caseload by zip code reports= SNAP data and Medicaid, etc.

After consulting, talking, and numbers what is the need you will tackle for the community?




# THE BUDGET

- Usual project/purchase budget
- Seek advice of others for special items (frigs)
- Research pricing, location, repair terms, warranty
- No unilateral decision discuss with others
- Know the time schedule entailed
- Talk to the possible vendors
- Make the costs firm they are entered on grant app






