How long have you been a MIMDA member? 2 years

What is your current clinical practice? I founded Ceptor Consulting, LLC to assist Post-acute Care physician practices in a variety of areas. CARE QUALITY OPPORTUNITIES

Polypharmacy Quality Improvement: Cheryl Huckins, MD CMD, is offering, to any member and/or their facilities, an opportunity to establish a **Drive to Deprescribe** quality improvement project. The success of a "D2D" workgroup at Evangelical Homes of Michigan in Saline, which reduced medications in long-term care by 18%, is going on the road to share lessons learned.

All that is necessary to start a group is a champion from the facility (DON, ADON), a provider (MD, NP, PA) and the consultant pharmacist.

Changing Talk (CHAT) communication training program -A message from University of Kansas School of Nursing faculty:

Dr. Kristine Williams and I from the University of Kansas School of Nursing are seeking nursing homes nationwide to participate in a NIH-funded research study testing a new online version of the evidence-based Changing Talk (CHAT) communication training program.

CHAT educates staff about reducing elderspeak (infantilizing communication) and results in reduced behavioral symptoms and need for psychotropic medication for residents with dementia. The new online version (Changing Talk: Online Training (CHATO)) consists of 3; one-hour interactive online modules that provide flexible and accessible access for staff.

There is no cost, direct-care staff can earn 3 contact hours, and all staff get a Certificate of Completion.

Benefits to you, your staff, and your residents include:

- A person-centered approach.
- Education about elderspeak and better communication strategies.
- Reduction in resistiveness to care and other behavioral symptoms in residents with dementia.
- Reduction in the need for psychotropic medication.
- Convenient, online educational format for busy nursing homes.
- Qualifies for CMS dementia care training hours requirements.
- A free, nonpharmacological, evidence-based intervention is an excellent addition to a Quality Improvement Plan.
