### **Architectural Sheet Metal Committee**

**Purpose:** The purpose of this Committee is to enhance the services that MRCA offers to provide a home within the MRCA for Architectural Sheet Metal Contractors and their industry equipment and material suppliers. This Committee is charged with: identifying potential members in these industry segments; recommending

new services, training, or resources needed by the industry; recommending tailored marketing of existing member services to this segment; and incorporating this segment into the 2019 Expo in Overland Park, Kansas

Projects: 2019 will again feature a fully-operational Sheet Metal Shop on the Expo floor and will expand to include more fabrication and education on the show floor including metal panel systems, detailing, SMANCA standards compliance and ES-1 Perimeter Edge requirements. The committee is also working on written content for members in both industry segments in each issue of MR Magazine and greater online support to help member contractors work more effectively with their customers through peer to peer support and online model documents and fact sheets.



#### **Business Management Committee**

**Purpose:** The purpose of this Committee assist MRCA members in the successful operation of their businesses. This committee also provides input to develop on-demand online resources and conference educational topics.

**Projects:** In addition to overseeing the Business Forms, online new and existing member benefit programs such as the Legal Services Plan, Beeline Purchasing, and the Harness Safety App. The Committee continues to review potential programs on insurance, consumer financing, point of purchase technology and drone certification. The Committee will play a key role this year in the website renovation and continues to work on adding more on-demand content for MRCA Members.

### **CERTA Taskforce**



**Purpose:** The purpose of this Taskforce is to oversee the administrative and marketing aspects of the MRCA/NRCA CERTA Torch Applicator Training Program.

**Goals:** MRCA has placed safety education as one of its highest goals. The promotion of CERTA and torch safety is one of the primary planks of the MRCA Safety Education platform. The MRCA Board has made sure that Safety in general and specifically CERTA, receives priority in funding in the MRCA budget.

As the MRCA CERTA Chairman, Jim Ramser is directing a program to emphasize the need for torch safety training involving any use of torches in roofing, and not just limited to the application of torch applied roofing systems. Most company trucks have a torch

so CERTA applicator training is important for almost all roofing employees. MRCA is also going to work to expand their program of working in conjunction with local and state partner associations in assisting in co-sponsoring CERTA applicator classes.







### **Steep Slope Committee**



**Chairperson: Brett Tesson**, Tesson Roofing & Exteriors. – St. Louis, MO

**Purpose:** The purpose of this Committee is to enhance the services that MRCA provides to steep slope contractors and material and service suppliers. This Committee is charged with: identifying potential members in these industry segments; recommending new

services, training, or resources needed by the industry; recommending tailored marketing of existing member services to this segment; and incorporating this segment into the 2019 Expo in Overland Park, Kansas.

**Projects:** This Committee is building on the momentum of success generated by previous Steep Slope Universities held in St. Louis and in Omaha. 2019 will showcase a peer to peer roundtable format that allows attendees to participate in multiple discussions and then receive a total summary of all the discussions after the event concludes! There will also be education and live demonstration programs specifically designed for Steep Slope Contractors and their crews at the 2019 Expo in Overland Park, Kansas. The Committee will also be a critical component of the new MRCA Website renovation and will host a special section of the site specifically for Steep Slope Contractors.








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
