The people surrounding me believed in me which further motivated me to continue. This type of support is not easy to obtain, and I am incredibly grateful to have found it in my life.




"I am excited to be in areas of New Jersey where I was for my childhood and show how much I have achieved and grown. I am excited to be near my family and be able to take care of them as well."




"From shadowing and now working under a New Jersey optometrist who practices in the area she grew up, I learned how special it is to give back to the community you've been a part of your whole life."
