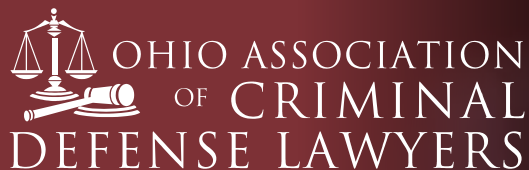

Presentation of the DONALD C. SCHUMACHER LIFESAVER AWARD. The OACDL created the DONALD C. SCHUMACHER LIFESAVER AWARD for Excellence in Death Penalty Litigation. This yearly award is designed to recognize outstanding achievements in avoiding imposition of the death penalty through trial excellence, mitigation investigation and presentation, as well as appellate and post-conviction litigation, and education.

Taxi service is approximately 15 minutes and an average \$25.00 cost. Exit straight out of main exit to 670 West. Follow 670 West to the 3RD Street exit. Follow 3RD Street approx. 7 traffic lights to State Street. The Sheraton Columbus at Capitol Square is on the right corner of 3RD and State Streets.

From North of Columbus (Cleveland)

Take I-71 South to the Spring Street Exit. Follow Spring Street to the West (Right Turn off exit) to 3RD Street and make a Left Turn. Follow 3RD Street approx. 4 traffic lights to State Street. The Sheraton Columbus at Capitol Square is on the right corner of 3RD and State Streets.

From East of Columbus (Zanesville, Pittsburgh)

Take I-70 West to the 4TH Street exit (Exit 100B). Turn right onto 4th Street and follow approx. 5 blocks to State Street. Turn left onto State Street and continue one block to 3RD Street. Turn left onto 3RD Street and the Hotel's Valet Parking is immediately to your right.

From West of Columbus (Dayton, Indianapolis)

Take I-70 East to the 4TH Street exit (100B). Turn left onto 4th Street and follow approx. 5 blocks to State Street. Turn left onto State Street and continue one block to 3RD Street. Turn left onto 3RD Street and the Hotel's Valet Parking is immediately to your right.

From South of Columbus (Cincinnati)

Take I-71 North to the 4th Street exit (exit 100B). Turn left onto 4TH Street and follow approx. 5 blocks to State Street. Turn left onto State Street and continue one block to 3RD Street. Turn left onto 3RD Street and the Hotel's Valet Parking is immediately to your right.

From Canton

Take 30 West to 71 South. Follow 71 South to 670 West (exit 109A). Follow 670 West to the 3RD Street exit (exit 4B). Follow 3RD Street approx. 7 traffic lights to State Street. The Sheraton Columbus at Capitol Square is on the right corner of 3RD and State Streets.

From Toledo/Detroit

Take 75 South to 23 South. Follow 23 South to 270 East. Follow 270 East to 71 South. Follow 71 South to 670 West (exit 109A) and follow to the 3RD Street exit (exit 4B). Follow 3RD Street approx. 7 traffic lights to State Street. The Sheraton Columbus at Capitol Square is on the right corner of 3RD and State Streets.
