

From East of Columbus (Zanesville, Pittsburgh)

From South of Columbus (Cincinnati)

Take I - 71 North to the 4th Street exit (exit 100B). Turn left onto 4TH Street and follow approx. 5 blocks to State Street. Turn left onto State Street and continue one block to 3RD Street. Turn left onto 3RD Street and the Hotel's Valet Parking is immediately to your right.

From Canton

Take 30 West to 71 South. Follow 71 South to 670 West (exit 109A). Follow 670 West to the 3RD Street exit (exit 4B). Follow 3RD Street approx. 7 traffic lights to State Street. The Sheraton Columbus at Capitol Square is on the right corner of 3RD and State Streets.

From Toledo/Detroit
