

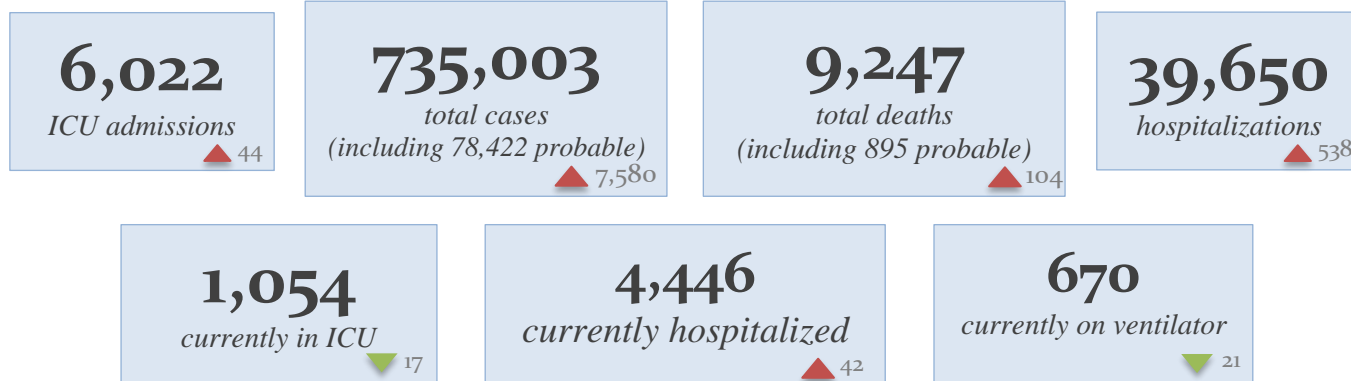


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## OHIO COVID-19 UPDATE

January 5, 2021

### THE LATEST NEWS

**GOVERNOR:** Governor DeWine gave an update on COVID-19 in Ohio's nursing homes. As of Sunday, 61% of nursing homes received their first visit from a pharmacy to receive their vaccines. Those who wanted to receive the vaccine were able to get it. But, only 40% of staff have been taking the vaccine when it is offered. With residents, it is around 75-80%.

Beginning Friday, many at nursing homes who received their first dose will begin receiving their second dose. Those who didn't choose to receive a dose in the first round can get their first dose then. Afterward, it could be a while before there is another chance for the vaccine.

Ohio Department of Aging Director, Ursel McElroy, discussed efforts to encourage residents and staff at nursing facilities to get the COVID-19 vaccine to protect themselves, their families, and their communities.


**VACCINE:** Governor DeWine gave an update on Phase 1B of the vaccine. Phase 1B focuses on those who are 65+. DeWine hopes in about 2 weeks that Phase 1B can begin, and also noted that Phase 1A will continue, as needed, as Phase 1B begins.

## PHASED APPROACH TO ADMINISTRATION



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Governor DeWine announced that Phase 1A of the vaccine will be available around December 15, 2020. Phase 1A of distribution priorities - in no particular order include:

**Ohio's Vaccination Program**  
*A Phased Approach*

**During Phase 1 vaccine supply will be limited.**  
Vaccine administration will be focused on reaching critical groups.

**PHASE 1A**

- Health care workers and personnel, who are routinely involved with the care of COVID-19 patients
- Residents and staff at nursing homes
- Residents and staff at assisted living facilities
- Patients and staff at state psychiatric hospitals
- People with developmental disabilities and those with mental health disorders, including substance use disorders, who live in group homes, residential facilities, or centers and staff at those locations
- Residents and staff at our Ohio veterans homes
- EMS responders

All available vaccines will be administered to those who **choose** to receive it.

- Adults who work in schools

All available vaccines will be administered to those who **choose** to receive it.

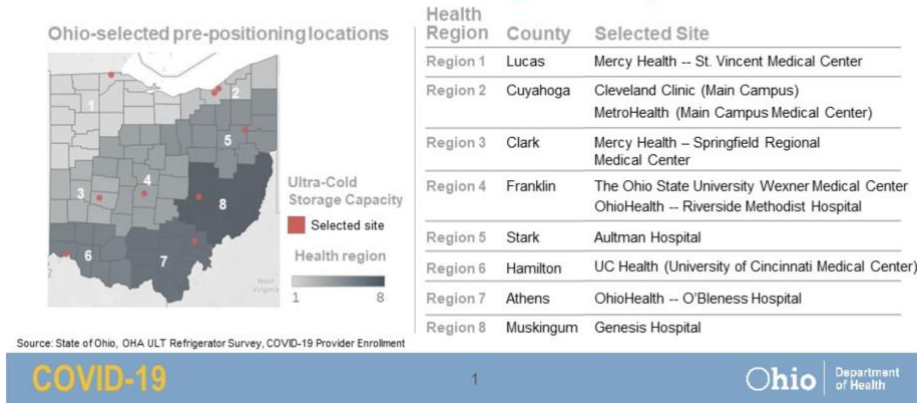
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# Ohio COVID-19 Vaccine Pre-Positioning Hospitals



The federal government has made it clear that we will not know for sure how many vaccines are coming until closer to the time the shipments are finalized.

Our current understanding, which is subject to change, is that we will receive a shipment from Pfizer on December 15<sup>th</sup> with 9,750 vaccines for hospitals (prepositioned sites) and 88,725 for Walgreens and CVS for congregate care settings. On December 22, we anticipate a shipment of 201,000 vaccines from Moderna. These will go to 98 hospitals and 108 health departments. Hospitals will vaccinate those dealing with COVID-19 patients. Health departments will vaccinate people like EMS, home health care works, and others.

## COVID-19 VACCINATION DASHBOARD

The COVID-19 Vaccination Dashboard is now live, and displays the most recent data reported to the Ohio Department of Health regarding the number of individuals that have started and completed the COVID-19 vaccination series by various demographics and county of residence. 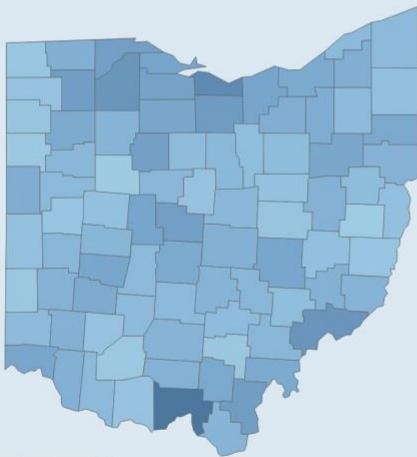

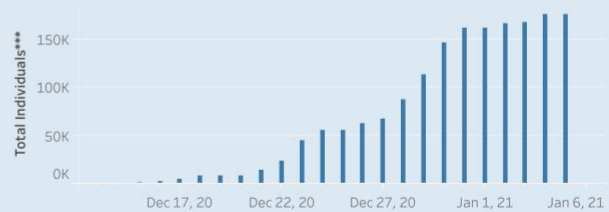

**PUBLIC HEALTH ADVISORY SYSTEM**

**Ohio's Public Health Advisory System is updated every Thursday**

The system consists of four levels that provide Ohioans with guidance as to the severity of the problem in the counties in which they live. The levels are determined by seven data indicators that identify the risk level for each county and a corresponding color code to represent that risk level.

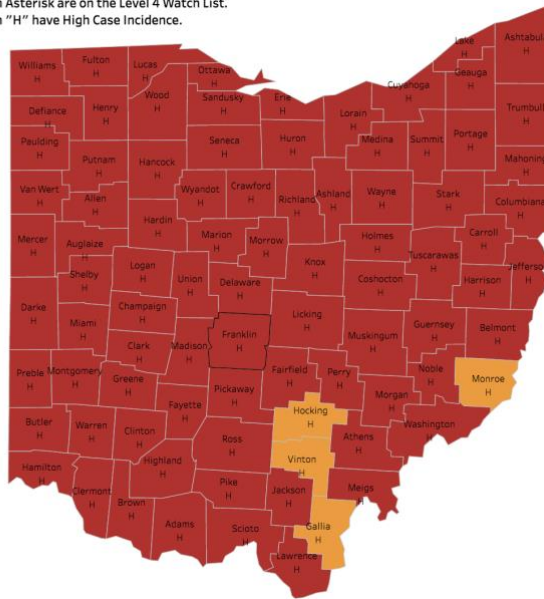

## TESTING LOCATIONS

DeWine has started a walk-up/drive-up testing initiative with the Ohio Association of Community Health Centers and their affiliate members (Community Health Centers) and the Ohio National Guard. These sites will also include other local community-based organizations i.e., faith-based organizations, community centers, food pantries, etc.

Testing for this initiative will be available for individuals with or without symptoms. The test has no out-of-pocket cost to the patient and individuals of any age are able to access the test. Minors will need signed consent of a parent/guardian.

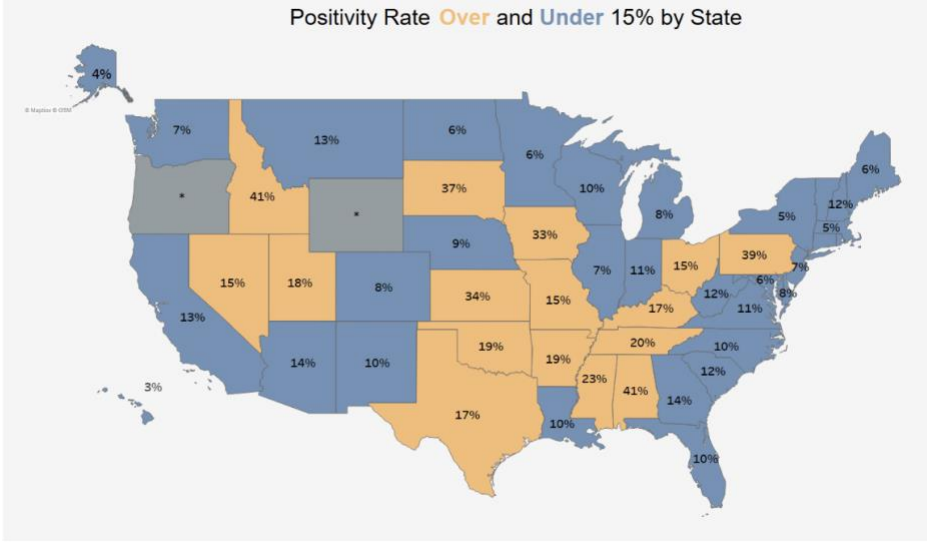

Those entering Ohio after travelling to states reporting positive testing rates of 15% or higher for COVID-19 are advised to self-quarantine for 14 days.

**January 5** – deaths rise to 9,247 total (895 probable), cases rise to 735,003 total (78,422 probable)

**December 30** – deaths rise to 8,855 total (846 probable), cases rise to 690,748 total (70,567 probable)

**December 23** – deaths rise to 8,361 total (748 probable), cases rise to 644,822 (61,704 probable)

**December 21** – deaths rise to 8,122 total (699 probable), cases rise to 629,354 (58,580 probable)

**December 17** - deaths rise to 7,894 total (653 probable), cases rise to 596,178 (53,492 probable)

**December 14** - deaths rise to 7,551 total (579 probable), cases rise to 570,602 (48,135 probable); first COVID-19 vaccine doses are administered in Ohio

**December 10** - deaths rise to 7,298 total (526 probable), cases rise to 531,850 (42,772 probable); Governor says he will be extending curfew and mask orders through Jan. 2

**December 7** - deaths rise to 7,022 total (478 probable), cases rise to 484,297 (25,304 probable)

**December 4** - deaths rise to 6,882 total (451 probable), cases rise to 456,963 (24,639 probable); DeWine announced phased approach to vaccine distribution

**December 3** - deaths rise to 6,753 total (449 probable), cases rise to 446,849 (24,001 probable)

**December 1** - deaths rise to 6,548 total (437 probable), cases rise to 430,093 (23,313 probable)
