Keynote Speaker

Francesco T. Mangano, DO, FACS, FACOS

Director, Division of Pediatric Neurosurgery Co-Director, Epilepsy Surgery Program Associate Professor, University of Cincinnati Department of Surgery

Francesco Mangano, DO joined the Division of Pediatric Neurosurgery at Cincinnati Children's in July, 2005, being appointed as the Director of the division in 2013. Dr. Mangano is board certified in neurological surgery through the American Osteopathic Board of Surgery. He earned his doctor in osteopathic medicine from Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine and participated in a residency program at NYCOM-Long Island and Jewish Medical Center/North Shore University Health System in New Hyde Park, New York. Dr. Mangano went on to complete a pediatric neurosurgery fellowship at Washington University School of Medicine - St. Louis Children's Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri. Dr. Mangano's major focus of interest is in reducing the frequency of debilitating seizures through surgical intervention. He is also a co-principal investigator for an NIH-funded multi-institutional study evaluating advanced MRI imaging techniques in children with congenital hydrocephalus. He has written and spoken extensively both nationally and internationally on epilepsy, diffuse tensor imaging, traumatic brain injury, and vascular and neoplastic brain lesions.
