Crisis Awareness Training provides participants possible physical examples of physical and emotional signs that a co-worker, family member, friend, or the employee themselves may be in crisis after a traumatic event. This can be brought about by an incident at work, in their personal life, or as the result of the cumulative effects of exposure to traumatic situations. Everyone's reactions to trauma are unique to that person, but this course gives some possible signs and symptoms, as well as techniques, to help someone who may benefit from assistance.

Issues discussed include: physical, cognitive, and emotional responses to trauma; alcohol/drug issues; techniques and strategies for working through the effects of a traumatic incident.
