



What is Youth Court?

An alternate approach to juvenile justice in which juvenile offenders are sentenced by a jury of their peers. These programs simultaneously offer education and "hands-on" experience in the legal system to the many community youth who volunteer.

Warren County sessions are held twice a month from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm during the school year.

Participant Recruiting Process

Every spring, presentations are made to all of the local high school government classes.

Students are given credit for community service that can go toward graduation requirements.

Volunteers are required to undergo mandatory training each year to participate.

Youth Court Participants

Youth role players consist of: Judge Bailiff Prosecutor Defense Attorney Jurors

Each youth participant is supervised by an adult professional who guides them through the judicial process.

Youth Court Respondents

Complaints are screened by the Probation Manager to determine eligibility. Warren County only accepts first-time offenders.


If there is a victim, they must also agree to the respondent's case being sent to Youth Court.

In order to participate, respondents must admit to the charge. Youth Court sessions are solely for disposition.

Potential Offenses

Each Court has the discretion to determine the criteria for acceptable cases.

Examples of offenses allowed are: Possession of Marijuana Theft (misdemeanor) Disorderly Conduct Criminal Trespass Criminal Damaging

Session Process

Participants and the respondent are asked to arrive 15 minutes early to meet with their adult professional. The adult provides guidance through the process.

The session proceeds as a normal court hearing. The jury imposes sanctions which then become diversion orders to be supervised by the Probation Manager.

Success Rate

Over the last 2 years, 33 out of 35 respondents have not had any further contact with the court.



Number of Participants

Since Fall 2021, there have been a total of 186 participants.

Of those 186, 29 students have come back for a second session.

Out of 29 students, 11 students have done at least three sessions.



Why Choose Youth Court?

Allows youth who would not have any experience in the judicial system to gain civic knowledge and explore potential career paths

Enhances community relations and collaborative efforts with local school districts

Gives students a voice to help their peers, fostering an understanding that they can be influential in solving problems
