BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections 4/23.43, 4/29.01, and 4/61.1/ of	4
the Revised Code be amended to read as follows:	5
Sec. 4723.43. A certified registered nurse anesthetist,	6
clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife, or certified	7
nurse practitioner may provide to individuals and groups nursing	8
care that requires knowledge and skill obtained from advanced	9
formal education and clinical experience. In this capacity as an	10
advanced practice registered nurse, a certified nurse-midwife is	11
subject to division (A) of this section, a certified registered	12
nurse anesthetist is subject to division (B) of this section, a	13
certified nurse practitioner is subject to division (C) of this	14
section, and a clinical nurse specialist is subject to division	15
(D) of this section.	16
(A) A nurse authorized to practice as a certified nurse-	17
midwife, in collaboration with one or more physicians, may	18



provide the management of preventive services and those primary	19
care services necessary to provide health care to women	20
antepartally, intrapartally, postpartally, and gynecologically,	21
consistent with the nurse's education and certification, and in	22
accordance with rules adopted by the board of nursing.	23
No certified nurse-midwife may perform version, deliver	24
breech or face presentation, use forceps, do any obstetric	25
operation, or treat any other abnormal condition, except in	26
emergencies. Division (A) of this section does not prohibit a	27
certified nurse-midwife from performing episiotomies or normal	28
	29
vaginal deliveries, or repairing vaginal tears. A certified	
nurse-midwife may, in collaboration with one or more physicians,	30
prescribe drugs and therapeutic devices in accordance with	31
section 4723.481 of the Revised Code.	32
(B) (1) A nurse authorized to practice as a certified	33
registered nurse anesthetist, with the supervision and in the	34
immediate presence of a physician, podiatrist, or dentist, may	35
administer anesthesia and perform anesthesia induction,	36
maintenance, and emergence, and may perform with supervision-	37
preanesthetic preparation and evaluation, postanesthesia care,	38
and clinical support functions, do all of the following	39
consistent with the nurse's education and certification, and in	40
accordance with rules adopted by the board.	41
The physician, podiatrist, or dentist supervising a	42
certified registered nurse anesthetist must be actively engaged	43
in practice in this state. When a certified registered nurse	44
anesthetist is supervised by a podiatrist, the nurse's scope of	45
practice is limited to the anesthesia procedures that the-	46
podiatrist has the authority under section 4731.51 of the	47

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Revised Code to perform. A certified registered nurse-

anesthetist may not administer general anesthesia under the	49
supervision of a podiatrist in a podiatrist's office. When a	50
certified registered nurse anesthetist is supervised by a	51
dentist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the	52
anesthesia procedures that the dentist has the authority under-	53
Chapter 4715. of the Revised Code to perform:	54
(a) Perform and document evaluations and assessments	55
during the perianesthesia period, which may include ordering and	56
evaluating one or more diagnostic tests and consulting with one	57
or more other health professionals;	58
(b) Establish anesthesia care plans;	59
(c) Determine whether planned anesthesia is appropriate;	60
(d) Obtain informed consent for anesthesia care;	61
(e) Select and order anesthesia;	62
(f) In the immediate presence of a physician, podiatrist,	63
or dentist, administer anesthesia and perform anesthesia	64
induction, maintenance, and emergence;	65
(g) Perform clinical functions that are either of the	66
<pre>following:</pre>	67
(i) Specified in the clinical experience standards	68
established for nurse anesthetist education programs by a	69
national accreditation organization selected by the board of	70
<pre>nursing;</pre>	71
(ii) Completed pursuant to a physician consultation.	72
(h) When performing clinical functions as provided in this	73
section, order fluids, treatments, drugs, and one or more	74
diagnostic tests and evaluate the results of such tests;	75

(i) As necessary for patient management and care in the	76
perianesthesia period, select, order, and administer fluids,	77
treatments, and drugs for conditions related to administration	78
of anesthesia;	79
(j) Direct registered nurses, licensed practical nurses,	80
and respiratory therapists to do any of the following that they	81
are authorized by law to do for patient management and care in	82
either the perianesthesia period or when the certified	83
registered nurse anesthetist performs clinical functions:	84
(i) Provide supportive care as necessary for patient	85
management and care, including monitoring vital signs,	86
conducting electrocardiograms, and performing intravenous	87
<pre>therapy;</pre>	88
(ii) Administer fluids, treatments, and drugs to treat	89
conditions related to administration of anesthesia.	90
(k) Perform and document postanesthesia care preparation	91
and evaluation;	92
(1) Perform postanesthesia care assessments, including on	93
admission to or release or discharge from postanesthesia	94
recovery areas;	95
(m) Select, order, and administer pain relief therapies	96
during the perianesthesia period.	97
(2) Division (B)(1) of this section does not authorize a	98
certified registered nurse anesthetist to prescribe a drug for	99
use outside the facility or other setting where the certified	100
registered nurse anesthetist provides care.	101
(3) The physician, podiatrist, or dentist supervising a	102
certified registered nurse anesthetist must be actively engaged	103

in practice in this state. When a certified registered nurse	104
anesthetist is supervised by a podiatrist, the nurse's scope of	105
practice is limited to the anesthesia procedures that the	106
podiatrist has the authority under section 4731.51 of the	107
Revised Code to perform. A certified registered nurse	108
anesthetist may not administer general anesthesia under the	109
supervision of a podiatrist in a podiatrist's office. When a	110
certified registered nurse anesthetist is supervised by a	111
dentist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the	112
anesthesia procedures that the dentist has the authority under	113
Chapter 4715. of the Revised Code to perform.	114
(C) A nurse authorized to practice as a certified nurse	115
practitioner, in collaboration with one or more physicians or	116
podiatrists, may provide preventive and primary care services,	117
provide services for acute illnesses, and evaluate and promote	118
patient wellness within the nurse's nursing specialty,	119
consistent with the nurse's education and certification, and in	120
accordance with rules adopted by the board. A certified nurse	121
practitioner may, in collaboration with one or more physicians	122
or podiatrists, prescribe drugs and therapeutic devices in	123
accordance with section 4723.481 of the Revised Code.	124
When a certified nurse practitioner is collaborating with	125
a podiatrist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the	126
procedures that the podiatrist has the authority under section	127
4731.51 of the Revised Code to perform.	128
(D) A nurse authorized to practice as a clinical nurse	129
specialist, in collaboration with one or more physicians or	130
podiatrists, may provide and manage the care of individuals and	131
groups with complex health problems and provide health care	132

services that promote, improve, and manage health care within

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the nurse's nursing specialty, consistent with the nurse's	134
education and in accordance with rules adopted by the board. A	135
clinical nurse specialist may, in collaboration with one or more	136
physicians or podiatrists, prescribe drugs and therapeutic	137
devices in accordance with section 4723.481 of the Revised Code.	138
When a clinical nurse specialist is collaborating with a	139
podiatrist, the nurse's scope of practice is limited to the	140
procedures that the podiatrist has the authority under section	141
4731.51 of the Revised Code to perform.	142
Sec. 4729.01. As used in this chapter:	143
(A) "Pharmacy," except when used in a context that refers	144
to the practice of pharmacy, means any area, room, rooms, place	145
of business, department, or portion of any of the foregoing	146
where the practice of pharmacy is conducted.	147
(B) "Practice of pharmacy" means providing pharmacist care	148
requiring specialized knowledge, judgment, and skill derived	149
from the principles of biological, chemical, behavioral, social,	150
pharmaceutical, and clinical sciences. As used in this division,	151
"pharmacist care" includes the following:	152
(1) Interpreting prescriptions;	153
(2) Dispensing drugs and drug therapy related devices;	154
(3) Compounding drugs;	155

(2) Pursuant to the modification of a prescription made in	185
accordance with a consult agreement;	186
(3) As an incident to research, teaching activities, or	187
chemical analysis;	188

(4) In anticipation of orders for drugs pursuant to	189
prescriptions, based on routine, regularly observed dispensing	190

(5) Pursuant to a request made by a licensed health	192

(2) Any other article intended for use in the diagnosis,	214
cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease in humans	215

(3) Any article, other than food, intended to affect the	217
structure or any function of the body of humans or animals;	218
(4) Any article intended for use as a component of any	219
article specified in division (E)(1), (2), or (3) of this	220
section; but does not include devices or their components,	221
parts, or accessories.	222
(F) "Dangerous drug" means any of the following:	223
(1) Dangerous drug means any of the forfowing.	223
(1) Any drug to which either of the following applies:	224
(a) Under the "Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act," 52	225
Stat. 1040 (1938), 21 U.S.C.A. 301, as amended, the drug is	226
required to bear a label containing the legend "Caution: Federal	227
law prohibits dispensing without prescription" or "Caution:	228
Federal law restricts this drug to use by or on the order of a	229
licensed veterinarian" or any similar restrictive statement, or	230
the drug may be dispensed only upon a prescription;	231
(b) Under Chapter 3715. or 3719. of the Revised Code, the	232
drug may be dispensed only upon a prescription.	233
(2) Any drug that contains a schedule V controlled	234

combinations or mixtures of drugs to be used by a particular	246
individual or for treating a particular animal, issued by a	247
licensed health professional authorized to prescribe drugs;	248
(2) For purposes of sections 2925.61, 4723.488, 4729.44,	249
4730.431, and 4731.94 of the Revised Code, a written,	250
electronic, or oral order for naloxone issued to and in the name	251
of a family member, friend, or other individual in a position to	252
assist an individual who there is reason to believe is at risk	253
of experiencing an opioid-related overdose.	254
(3) For purposes of sections 4723.4810, 4729.282,	255
4730.432, and 4731.93 of the Revised Code, a written,	256
electronic, or oral order for a drug to treat chlamydia,	257
gonorrhea, or trichomoniasis issued to and in the name of a	258
patient who is not the intended user of the drug but is the	259
sexual partner of the intended user;	260
(4) For purposes of sections 3313.7110, 3313.7111,	261
3314.143, 3326.28, 3328.29, 4723.483, 4729.88, 4730.433,	262

or oral order for an epinephrine autoinjector issued to and in	264
the name of a school, school district, or camp;	265
(5) For purposes of Chapter 3728. and sections 4723.483,	266

electronic, or oral order for an epinephrine autoinjector issued	268
to and in the name of a qualified entity, as defined in section	269

(I) "Licensed health professional authorized to prescribe	271
drugs" or "prescriber" means an individual who is authorized by	272

law to prescribe drugs or dangerous drugs or drug therapy	273
related devices in the course of the individual's professional	274
practice, including only the following:	275
(1) A dentist licensed under Chapter 4715. of the Revised	276
Code;	277
(2) A clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife,	278
or certified nurse practitioner who holds a current, valid	279
license to practice nursing as an advanced practice registered	280
nurse issued under Chapter 4723. of the Revised Code;	281
(3) A certified registered nurse anesthetist who holds a	282
current, valid license to practice nursing as an advanced	283
practice registered nurse, but only to the extent of the nurse's	284
authority under division (B) of section 4723.43 of the Revised	285

(J) "Sale" or "sell" includes any transaction made by any	300

person, whether as principal proprietor, agent, or employee, to	301
do or offer to do any of the following: deliver, distribute,	302
broker, exchange, gift or otherwise give away, or transfer,	303
whether the transfer is by passage of title, physical movement,	304
or both.	305
(K) "Wholesale sale" and "sale at wholesale" mean any sale	306
in which the purpose of the purchaser is to resell the article	307
purchased or received by the purchaser.	308
(L) "Retail sale" and "sale at retail" mean any sale other	309
than a wholesale sale or sale at wholesale.	310
(M) "Retail seller" means any person that sells any	311
dangerous drug to consumers without assuming control over and	312
responsibility for its administration. Mere advice or	313
instructions regarding administration do not constitute control	314
or establish responsibility.	315
(N) "Price information" means the price charged for a	316
prescription for a particular drug product and, in an easily	317
understandable manner, all of the following:	318
(1) The proprietary name of the drug product;	319
(2) The established (generic) name of the drug product;	320
(3) The strength of the drug product if the product	321
contains a single active ingredient or if the drug product	322
contains more than one active ingredient and a relevant strength	323
can be associated with the product without indicating each	324
active ingredient. The established name and quantity of each	325
active ingredient are required if such a relevant strength	326
cannot be so associated with a drug product containing more than	327
one ingredient.	328

(4) The dosage form;	329
(5) The price charged for a specific quantity of the drug	330
product. The stated price shall include all charges to the	331
consumer, including, but not limited to, the cost of the drug	332
product, professional fees, handling fees, if any, and a	333
statement identifying professional services routinely furnished	334
by the pharmacy. Any mailing fees and delivery fees may be	335
stated separately without repetition. The information shall not	336
be false or misleading.	337
(O) "Wholesale distributor of dangerous drugs" or	338
"wholesale distributor" means a person engaged in the sale of	339
dangerous drugs at wholesale and includes any agent or employee	340
of such a person authorized by the person to engage in the sale	341
of dangerous drugs at wholesale.	342
(P) "Manufacturer of dangerous drugs" or "manufacturer"	343
means a person, other than a pharmacist or prescriber, who	344
manufactures dangerous drugs and who is engaged in the sale of	345
those dangerous drugs.	346
(Q) "Terminal distributor of dangerous drugs" or "terminal	347
distributor" means a person who is engaged in the sale of	348
dangerous drugs at retail, or any person, other than a	349
manufacturer, repackager, outsourcing facility, third-party	350
logistics provider, wholesale distributor, or pharmacist, who	351
has possession, custody, or control of dangerous drugs for any	352
purpose other than for that person's own use and consumption.	353
"Terminal distributor" includes pharmacies, hospitals, nursing	354
homes, and laboratories and all other persons who procure	355
dangerous drugs for sale or other distribution by or under the	356
supervision of a pharmacist or licensed health professional	357
authorized to prescribe drugs.	358

(R) "Promote to the public" means disseminating a	359
representation to the public in any manner or by any means,	360
other than by labeling, for the purpose of inducing, or that is	361
likely to induce, directly or indirectly, the purchase of a	362
dangerous drug at retail.	363
(S) "Person" includes any individual, partnership,	364
association, limited liability company, or corporation, the	365
state, any political subdivision of the state, and any district,	366
department, or agency of the state or its political	367
subdivisions.	368
(T) "Animal shelter" means a facility operated by a humane	369
society or any society organized under Chapter 1717. of the	370
Revised Code or a dog pound operated pursuant to Chapter 955. of	371
the Revised Code.	372
(U) "Food" has the same meaning as in section 3715.01 of	373
the Revised Code.	374
(V) "Pain management clinic" has the same meaning as in	375
section 4731.054 of the Revised Code.	376
(W) "Investigational drug or product" means a drug or	377
product that has successfully completed phase one of the United	378
States food and drug administration clinical trials and remains	379
under clinical trial, but has not been approved for general use	380
by the United States food and drug administration.	381
"Investigational drug or product" does not include controlled	382
substances in schedule I, as established pursuant to section	383
3719.41 of the Revised Code, and as amended.	384
(X) "Product," when used in reference to an	385
investigational drug or product, means a biological product,	386
other than a drug, that is made from a natural human, animal, or	387

microorganism source and is intended to treat a disease or	388
medical condition.	389
(Y) "Third-party logistics provider" means a person that	390
provides or coordinates warehousing or other logistics services	391
pertaining to dangerous drugs including distribution, on behalf	392
of a manufacturer, wholesale distributor, or terminal	393
distributor of dangerous drugs, but does not take ownership of	394
the drugs or have responsibility to direct the sale or	395
disposition of the drugs.	396
(Z) "Repackager of dangerous drugs" or "repackager" means	397
a person that repacks and relabels dangerous drugs for sale or	398
distribution.	399
(AA) "Outsourcing facility" means a facility that is	400
engaged in the compounding and sale of sterile drugs and is	401
registered as an outsourcing facility with the United States	402
food and drug administration.	403
Sec. 4761.17. All of the following apply to the practice	404
of respiratory care by a person who holds a license or limited	405
permit issued under this chapter:	406
(A) The person shall practice only pursuant to a	407
prescription or other order for respiratory care issued by any	408
of the following:	409
(1) A physician;	410
(2) A clinical nurse specialist, certified nurse-midwife,	411
or certified nurse practitioner who holds a current, valid	412
license issued under Chapter 4723. of the Revised Code to	413
practice nursing as an advanced practice registered nurse and	414
has entered into a standard care arrangement with a physician;	415

(3) A certified registered nurse anesthetist who holds a	416
current, valid license issued under Chapter 4723. of the Revised	417
Code to practice nursing as an advanced practice registered	418
nurse and acts in compliance with division (B) of section	419
4723.43 of the Revised Code;	420
(4) A physician assistant who holds a valid prescriber	421
number issued by the state medical board, has been granted	422
physician-delegated prescriptive authority, and has entered into	423
a supervision agreement that allows the physician assistant to	424
prescribe or order respiratory care services.	425
(B) The person shall practice only under the supervision	426
of any of the following:	427
(1) A physician;	428
(2) A certified nurse practitioner, certified nurse-	429
midwife, or clinical nurse specialist;	430
(3) A physician assistant who is authorized to prescribe	431
or order respiratory care services as provided in division (A)	432
(3) of this section.	433
(C)(1) When practicing under the prescription or order of	434
a certified nurse practitioner, certified nurse midwife, or	435
clinical nurse specialist or under the supervision of such a	436
nurse, the person's administration of medication that requires a	437
prescription is limited to the drugs that the nurse is	438
authorized to prescribe pursuant to section 4723.481 of the	439
Revised Code.	440
(2) When practicing under the order of a certified	441
registered nurse anesthetist, the person's administration of	442
medication is limited to the drugs that the nurse is authorized	443
to order or direct the person to administer, as provided in	444

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division (B) of section 4723.43 of the Revised Code.	445
(3) When practicing under the prescription or order of a	446
physician assistant or under the supervision of a physician	447
assistant, the person's administration of medication that	448
requires a prescription is limited to the drugs that the	449
physician assistant is authorized to prescribe pursuant to the	450
physician assistant's physician-delegated prescriptive	451
authority.	452
Section 2. That existing sections 4723.43, 4729.01, and	453
4761.17 of the Revised Code are hereby repealed.	454
