COURSE FACULTY

Paul Evans DO, LL.D (hon), FACOFP

Dr. Evans served as the founding Dean of both Marian University College of Osteopathic Medicine in Indianapolis, Indiana and prior to that at the Georgia Campus Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (GA-PCOM). Prior to his retirement, Dr. Evans was the Vice Dean and Director of Bryan Leadership and Education Institute at the Western University of Health Sciences College of Osteopathic Medicine of the Pacific NW. Dr. Evans has had extensive experience in academic and military medicine, including serving as Family Medicine residency program director, chairperson, and director of a multispecialty primary care group, with over 26 years in military medicine.

Michael P. Rowane, DO, MS, FAAFP, FAAO

Dr. Rowane is the Associate Dean of Clinical Education at the Lake Erie College of Osteopathic Medicine where he is also a Professor of Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine and Family Medicine. Prior to this he was Director of Medical Education of University Hospitals Regional Hospitals and Family Medicine Program Director at University Hospitals Cleveland Medical Center, both in the Cleveland, Ohio. He is currently the Immediate Past-President of the American Academy of Osteopathy. He has also served on the Accreditation Council of Graduate Medical Education [ACGME] Osteopathic Principles Committee.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Drs. Evans and Rowane, the primary faculty of the course are the authors of "Basic Musculoskeletal Manipulation: the 15 Minute Office Visit," the accompanying textbook for the course. This course will teach basic assessment and treatment for low back pain, thoracic and neck pain with Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment [OMT]. The course, sometimes referred to as "Osteopathic Manipulation 101," is designed for both novice MD and experienced DO physicians who may feel a bit rusty as well as osteopathic physicians with expertise, but desire exposure to a method to teach osteopathic concepts will benefit from this course as well. The course is broken up into two parts. The first part is the basic OMT curriculum taught to DO and MD residents and attending physicians. The second part is a faculty development session to review teaching concepts and specific tips on supervising residents and students by DO and MD faculty. There is an optional 3rd day for added OMT training with a regional faculty. In addition, this course is an ideal introduction for non-osteopathic students and attending physicians who are considering entering ACGME Osteopathic Recognition training programs.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Perform basic assessment and treatment techniques for common somatic dysfunction
- Treat musculoskeletal conditions involving low back pain, thoracic pain and neck pain using basic manipulation techniques to the following areas:
 - o long restrictors (piriformis and psoas),
 - o sacroiliac joint,
 - o lumbar spine,
 - o thoracic region,
 - o cervical spine, and
 - the application of OMT in evaluating and treating the hospitalized patient.
- Demonstrate how to use of all diagnostic and treatment skills in a simulated 15 minute office visit
- Discuss how to appropriately bill and code when using Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment [OMT].
- Develop a curricular model to teach basic manipulation at each attendee's individual training program.
- Review chart and supervision strategies for MD physicians who supervise DO residents doing OMT.

Course Background

This course is an integration of formal curriculum in Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine / Musculoskeletal Medicine refined over the past 20 years by Drs. Evans and Rowane. This course has been successfully given in Family Medicine and Sports Medicine residencies and fellowships as well as state and national conferences. The curriculum by Drs. Evans and Rowane for this course was developed to train primary care MD's and tested as prospective randomized trial through the Sheps Center of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and published in *Spine*. [*Spine* 2000:25:22: 2954-2961.] This is an evidenced-based method to utilizing Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment in a clinical setting presented in an understandable manner to engage all participants to obtain practical skills.

The unique course is scheduled for **Friday and Saturday**, **January 18**th **and 19**th, **2019**. The Manipulation in Primary Care Course will take place in the Cleveland, Ohio at the **Ritz-Carlton Downtown Cleveland**. The Cleveland Academy of Osteopathic Medicine, the Ohio Osteopathic Foundation and the Lake Erie Consortium for Osteopathic Medical Training (LECOMT) are sponsoring the course together.

NOTE: The CAOM January Seminar will have an additional eight [8] hour all day program incorporating Osteopathic Principles and Practices [OPP] / Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment [OMT] on Sunday, January 20, 2019 for any participants wishing to attend. This will allow any participant to complete an anticipated twenty-four [24] hours of CME credits on the application of OPP/OMT by attending both programs.

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BACKGROUND: This course is designed for physicians with little or no prior experience who wish to learn basic manipulation skills for assessing and treating common clinical problems. It will also serve as a good review for DOs who wish to refresh their skills, as well as those with expertise, but desire exposure to a method to teach osteopathic concepts. An osteopathic framework emphasizing soft tissue (ST), myofascial release (MFR), muscle energy (ME) and high velocity-low amplitude (HVLA) techniques will be used. Participants will learn focused examination tips and basic treatment techniques, working on each other as simulated patients. Techniques will cover cervical, thoracic, lumbar, and sacral areas as well as special cases. Common clinical cases will be presented for attendees to solve using newly learned skills under instructor supervision to ensure competence and confidence.
