RESOLVED, that the following POLICY STATEMENT be amended and affirmed:
WHEREAS, osteopathic physicians have traditionally provided care for injured workers in the State of Ohio; and
WHEREAS, THE OHIO OSTEOPATHIC ASSOCIATION, BUSINESS REPRESENTATIVES, ORGANIZED LABOR, OTHER HEALTH-CARE PROVIDER ORGANIZATIONS, AND THE BUREAU OF WORKERS COMPENSATION JOINTLY CREATED THE HEALTH PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (HPP) AS A UNIQUE MANAGED-CARE SYSTEM TO MEET CUSTOMERS' NEEDS FOR YEARS TO COME; AND
WHEREAS, HPP IS TRULY A PARTNERSHIP, WHERE THE PRIVATE-SECTOR MANAGED CARE ORGANIZATIONS (MCOS) ARE WORKING TOGETHER WITH THE BWC TO PROVIDE COMPREHENSIVE CLAIMS-MANAGEMENT AND MEDICAL- MANAGEMENT SERVICES FOR THE EMPLOYERS AND EMPLOYEES OF OHIO; NOW THEREFORE, BE IT
WHEREAS, the Ohio Osteopathic Association (OOA) had been instrumental in working with multiple stakeholder groups from the State of Ohio to develop the Health Partnership Program (HPP) to reform processes of the Ohio Bureau of Worker's Compensation to help injured workers get the care that they needed in a timely fashion; and
WHEREAS, osteopathic physicians provide a holistic approach to caring for injured workers in an attempt to give them appropriate and efficient treatments to get them back to work as soon as they are able to do so; and
WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, due to several changes at the Bureau of Worker's Compensation, over the last year, has seen fit to significantly downsize the BWC Provider Relations Staff; and
WHEREAS, any increase in the time and effort required to process BWC claims, in physician offices, will likely decrease access of injured workers to osteopathic physicians and other providers; now therefore be it
RESOLVED, that the OOA support legislation to avoid dismantling of the BWC's Health Partnership Program; and be it further
RESOLVED, that the OOA, through its BUREAU OF WORKERS COMPENSATION representatives to the BWC, work to be an CONTINUE TO activeLY PARTICIPATE participant in any attempts to reform ON-GOING EFFORTS TO MAINTAIN AND IMPROVE the HEALTH PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (HPP), so as to maintain AS an
