9	2010 states health literacy is the capacity to obtain, process, and understand basic health

13 14	WHEREAS, two-thirds of US adults age 60 and over have inadequate or marginal
15	literacy skills; and

17	WHEREAS, 81 percent of patients age 60 and older cannot read or understand basic
18	materials such as prescription labels and 85 percent of unwed mothers are illiterate; and
19 20	WHEREAS, approximately half of all Medicare/Medicaid recipients read below the fifth-
20 21	grade level; now, therefore, be it

23	RESOLVED, that the Ohio Osteopathic Association strongly support the campaign
24	against health illiteracy; and, be it further

26 27	RESOLVED, that the OOA strongly encourage all practitioners and medical facilities to create a shame-free environment where low-literate patients can seek help without feeling
27	stigmatized; and, be it further
