Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) Collaborative Practice Agreement in Primary Care

Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) medications are highly effective at preventing HIV infections for patients at risk through sexual exposure or injection drug use and is only prescribed for 25% of the eligible patient population in the United States. A pharmacy collaborative practice agreement (CPA) was developed for PrEP in the primary care setting. The pharmacist-led PrEP visits were piloted at one clinic location alongside a physician specializing in infectious disease in October 2021 and are now offered at all the clinics. Results of the new service regarding increased patient access and the safety/monitoring practices implemented will be discussed.

Pharmacist Led Spirometry Clinic and COPD Services in a Rural FQHC

Family Health Services of Darke County (FHS) serves a rural, underserved patient population in western Ohio in their management of chronic disease states, including Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD). As of November 2021, over 1,300 FHS patients have a diagnosis of COPD. With a high population of smokers, patients working with inhaled toxins in the workplace, and individuals in lower socioeconomic standing, this session will describe how to best address needs and opportunities to improve care in this area,

Pharmacist-Provided Deprescribing Service in an Independent Community Pharmacy

Addressing polypharmacy is of critical importance, with the population of adults aged 65 and older expected to rise to 72 million by 2030. This has many implications on the healthcare system, including increased healthcare costs, risk of adverse events, drug-drug interactions and non-adherence, and reduced functional capacity. . The aim of Uptown Pharmacy's MedCheck deprescribing program is to safely reduce the medication burden for patients through one-on-one consultations and interprofessional collaboration with local Westerville physicians.

Innovations in an Orthopedic Surgical Hospital

Crystal Clinic Orthopaedic Center is a physician owned specialty hospital system with board-certified and fellowship-trained orthopedic and plastic surgeons who perform more than 17,000 surgeries each year at two surgical locations. The pharmacy department recently leveraged technology and collaborative practice agreements to grow pharmacy staffing and implement new clinical pharmacy services. This session will describe a number of innovative care programs at this institution including in the areas of antimicrobial usage for surgical prophylaxis and barcode medication scanning workflow in the operating room.
