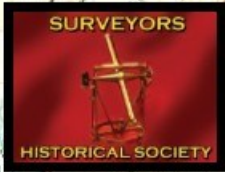

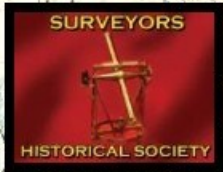

# SPEAKERS AND PRESENTATIONS

## "WILLIAM EIMBECK AND THE SURVEY OF THE 39<sup>TH</sup> PARALLEL BY THE U.S. COAST SURVEY"

**CAPTAIN ALBERT (SKIP) E. THEBERGE** retired from the NOAA Central Library this past September after 49 years with the agency and its predecessor ESSA. He was a member of the NOAA commissioned corps for 27 years and retired in 1995. NOAA Corps is a descendant of the United States Coast Survey, known also as the United States Coast and Geodetic Survey. He spent much of his NOAA Corps career involved in seafloor mapping and nautical charting work. Since retirement from NOAA Corps, he was associated with the NOAA Central Library as chief of reference and also as historian of the Coast Survey. He recorded many aspects of the history of the Coast and Geodetic Survey and also of the history of oceanography, having written the on-line book The Coast Survey 1807-1867, edited Hidden Depths: Atlas of the Oceans which accompanied the opening of the Sant Ocean Hall, and published over 75 articles in Hydro International, The American Surveyor, and other venues.



## "THE LIFE AND EXPLORATIONS OF JOHN WESLEY POWELL"

**MICHAEL STEWART** is a recent graduate of Utah Valley University (UVU) where he graduated as the Valedictorian of the College of Engineering and Technology with a Bachelor of Science in Geomatics with a Minor in Business Management. He is on his way to becoming a licensed land surveyor in Utah and Arizona with plans to also become a Certified Federal Surveyor (CFedS). While a student at UVU, he researched and wrote an extensive research paper on John Wesley Powell; traveled with a small team to scan and survey the active archeological site, Beit Leht, just south of Jerusalem, Israel and was the President of the Geospatial Society of UVU. Michael was born and raised in the small Southern Utah town of Kanab where, after graduating from UVU, he now resides with his wife Carlee. He is employed with a private firm as a crew chief and GIS analyst.



## "SPANISH EXPLORATION OF THE OLD SPANISH TRAIL"

**JEREMIAH R. CUNNINGHAM** is the survey manager and project surveyor at the Utah branch of Entellus, Inc., in Woods Cross, Utah. An Alaskan native, Jeremiah comes from a family with a land-surveying background, having surveyed northern and central Utah with his father, Walter, as a teenager. Jeremiah began surveying full-time in 2005. He graduated from Salt Lake Community College with an A.A.S. in Surveying Technology in 2009 and licensed as a Professional Land Surveyor in Utah in 2014. He has been a member of the Golden Spike chapter of the Utah Council of Land Surveyors since 2011. Jeremiah also currently serves as the County Surveyor for Morgan County, Utah. Jeremiah is pursuing a Bachelor of Science degree in Land Surveying from Utah Valley University and plans to graduate in 2020. Jeremiah Cunningham is bilingual in English and Spanish, and his wife is from Mexico City. His research into the Old Spanish Trail originated from his interest in Mexican history and the prolific effects that Spanish and Mexican explorers and missionaries had on the Western region of the United States of America. His presentation to the Surveyors Historical Society was prepared from this research in conjunction with his university studies.



## "STANSBURY'S 1849-50 EXPEDITION TO THE GREAT SALT LAKE"

**JOHN B. STAHL, PLS, CFedS**, is a registered professional land surveyor in the states of Utah and Montana, currently owning and operating Cornerstone Professional Land Surveys, Inc., and Cornerstone Land Consulting, Inc., in Salt Lake City. Mr. Stahl specializes in surveying land boundaries, resolving boundary conflicts, performing title and historical research, land boundary consultation services, mediation, and dispute resolution. He has been qualified as an expert witness in numerous boundary, access, and negligence cases and has actively participated in the preparation of amicus curiae briefs to the Utah Supreme Court. Mr. Stahl has served his profession as state chairman of the Utah Council of Land Surveyors and a Utah delegate to the Western Federation of Professional Surveyors. He is an adjunct instructor for the Salt Lake Community College and the Utah Valley University, where he has taught mathematics, ethics and liability and boundary law courses for land surveying students since 1991. Mr. Stahl received his A.A.S. degree in land surveying from Flathead Valley Community College in Kalispell, Montana and has authored numerous articles and publications covering topics on boundary laws, research, and resolving conflicts of evidence. He has also conducted historical research and written articles on several important milestones in the surveying past including the Uintah Special Meridian Initial Point, the Four Corners Monument, and the Gunnison Massacre.





## "THEODORE JUDAH AND THE TRANSCONTENTAL RAILROAD"



**C. BARTON (BART) CRATTIE** is a Land Surveyor in Tennessee and Georgia, a Certified Floodplain Manager through ASFPM and is a Certified Floodplain Surveyor (TN003). He currently serves as Secretary for the Surveyors Historical Society. Crattie represents the State of Tennessee as its Director with the National Society of Professional Surveyors (NSPS) and Chairs that state's History Committee. He has authored numerous articles over the years for Backsights, the old ACSM Journal, American Surveyor magazine, state publications, and various news outlets. He consulted with and appeared on the television program "How the States Got Their Shapes". Bart has presented to various organizations on the Bilby Steel Tower for Triangulation, Property Descriptions, the GA/TN state line controversy and multiple floodplain issues. His current project is working to establish a Certified Floodplain Surveyors program on a national level through NSPS.

## "HISTORY OF THE SALT LAKE MERIDIAN INITIAL POINT"



**DANIEL WEBB** is Chief Cadastral Surveyor for the federal government in Utah. He has worked for the Bureau of Land Management as a Land Surveyor in Alaska, the Washington D.C. Headquarters Office, and in Utah. Dan has been a member of the Utah Council of Land Surveyors for 22 years. He is a 1980 graduate of Michigan Technological University with Bachelor of Science in Land Surveying and is registered as a Professional Land Surveyor in State of Alaska. The Cadastral Chief position is delegated the responsibility for the United States Cadastral Survey Program in the State of Utah, for official survey and survey records of all Federal interest lands. Daniel oversees that Cadastral surveys are planned, organized, executed, with Federal boundaries that are established or reestablished; records created, reviewed, approved, and maintained. Daniel and his staff provide advice and counsel to the BLM, other Federal agencies, and State and local authorities, professional, and the public, on matters of the Public Land Survey System (PLSS).

## "ORSON PRATT; EARLY SURVEYOR AND ASTRONOMER FOR THE LDS CHURCH"



**Spencer McCutcheon** is a surveying student at Utah Valley University. Spencer McCutcheon was born in Manti Utah. Spencer grew up in a little town called Redmond where he loved to be in the outdoors. Spencer has worked in the construction field for most of his working career. He spent 4 years as an excavator. He is currently working for a land surveying company called CIS, out of Nephi Utah. He has worked as a land surveyor for 4 years and loves every minute of it. Spencer is currently at Utah Valley University pursuing his bachelor's degree in Geomatics, where he plans to graduate in the Spring of 2020. ## "SURVEYS AND SURVEY METHODS OF THE U.S. TOPOGRAPHICAL ENGINEERS IN UTAH TERRITORY"



**DON ERICKSON** is the owner of Image Exploration in Littleton, Colorado. His firm specializes in photo geologic-geomorphic mapping, remote sensing interpretations, and field mapping, primarily for petroleum exploration. In addition to the United States, he has been involved in mapping in areas as varied as Myanmar, Thailand, Oman, Iran, Paraguay, Ethiopia, Guatemala, Mexico, Jordan, Yemen, and many areas in China. He has published many articles dealing with the earth sciences and made numerous presentations to national and international conferences. He is also a Principal of Bent, St. Vrain & Co., a non-profit Corporation for historical education. He has served for several years as Bureau Chief for the U.S. Corps of Topographical Engineers, a living history group portraying the history and techniques of the Corps from its inception through the Civil War.

## "THE FOUR CORNERS MONUMENT: A Brief History and Why it is Exactly Right"



**WILLIAM STONE** is a geodesist with NOAA's National Geodetic Survey (NGS). As the NGS Southwest Region Geodetic Advisor, he assists the geospatial community throughout Arizona, New Mexico and Utah (and beyond) with proper use of the National Spatial Reference System and related geodetic infrastructure, tools, and data. Bill has been with NGS since 1989, and he began his federal geodetic career with the Defense Mapping Agency (now National Geospatial-Intelligence Agency) in Wyoming. He has worked throughout the West, with favorite projects including fieldwork in Yellowstone, Grand Canyon, Sierra Nevada, Lake Powell, San Juan Mountains, Cascade Range, coastal Alaska, and Chaco Culture National Historical Park (NM). In 2009, he spearheaded the NGS effort to debunk the erroneous notion that somehow the Four Corners Monument was in error by 2.5 miles. Bill holds a BA in Physics from Bowdoin College in Maine and an MS in Physical Oceanography from the Scripps Institution of Oceanography in California. He lives in Santa Fe, NM.

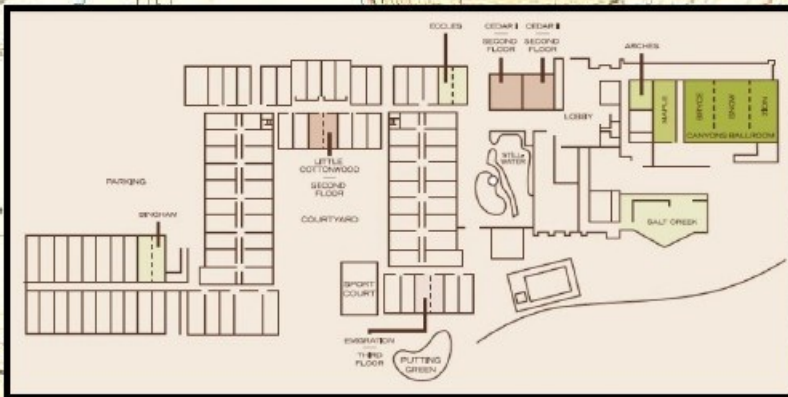

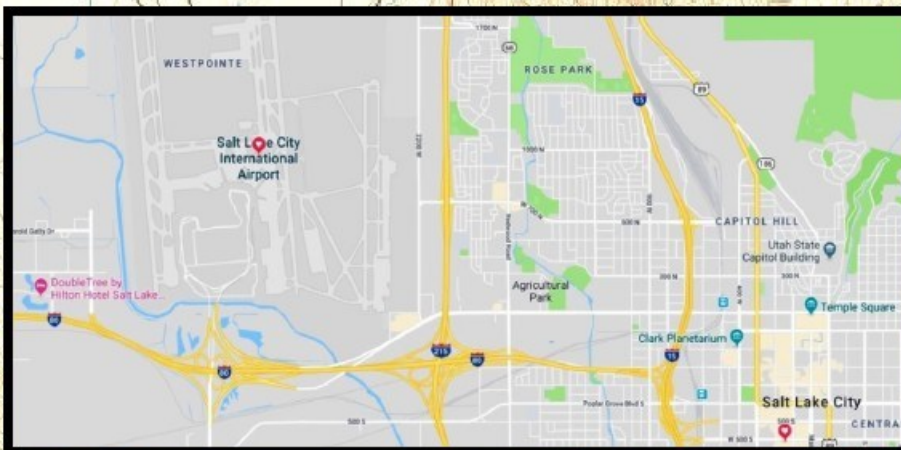
