THE HYMN LIST: This hymn list is coordinated with the calendar followed by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and suggests hymns related to the lectionary of the church as embodied by the Revised Common Lectionary system, and as found in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship.* The hymns in this listing are suggested from the following worship resources published Augsburg Fortress, the official publication house of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America:

PRIMARY SOURCE

Evangelical Lutheran Worship © 2006 - This book contains the most current, officially adopted liturgies and hymn collection of the ELCA. Abbreviation: *ELW* All hymn numbers on this list printed in **bold type** are from *Evangelical Lutheran Worship.*

OTHER SOURCES:

- *Lutheran Book of Worship* © 1978 This book contains the previous adopted liturgies and hymn collection of the ELCA. Abbreviation: *LBW.*
- *With One Voice* © 1995 This volume appeared as a liturgical and hymn supplement to the *Lutheran Book of Worship*. Abbreviation: *WOV*.
- *This Far by Faith* © 1999 This liturgical resource and hymn collection is geared toward the African American worship experience. It was a cooperative effort between the ELCA and the Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod. Abbreviation: *TFF.*
- *Worship & Praise* © 1999 This volume is a songbook collection of "praise songs" and contemporary hymns. Abbreviation: *W&P*.

CONTENTS:

~ Scripture and hymns. According to traditional Lutheran custom, the hymns in a given worship service should reflect and undergird themes found in the appointed scriptures of the day. So this listing provides hymns suggestions that thematically connect with or are even directly based on specific scripture passages. *Note:* Some of the hymn suggestions are preceded by the citation of specific verses of the particular pericopé involved. These verse numbers are given in parentheses.

~ **Psalms.** The synodical hymn listing also suggests hymns connected to the liturgically appointed psalms. The psalms, while definitely part of scripture, also constitute the "hymn book" of the Bible and should really be sung and not read. (*Evangelical Lutheran Worship* provides psalm tones for singing the psalms on pages 337 and 338.) Hymns are being suggested for the psalm texts for two reasons. First, there may be situations where singing the actual psalm text is just not possible, but singing a hymn based on a psalm can be done.

Secondly, a preacher may decide to base a sermon on the appointed psalm for the day, and so may need hymns that reflect the psalm's theme for use in other places in the service. **Note:** Not every psalm in the rotation of pericopés has a related hymn in any of our sources. For those situations no hymns are listed, but just the citation of the appointed psalm is given. **Seasonal blessings.** A series of alternate benedictions are provided throughout this listing, each appropriate to a specific season of the church year. They are to be understood as alternatives to the three blessings printed at the end of the eucharistic liturgies in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*, that is, the Trinitarian benediction, the Aaronic benediction, and a benediction based on Romans 15:5, 13. The alternate benedictions printed in this hymn listing are taken from the ELCA's African American worship resource, **This Far by Faith**, pages 91-93.

SPECIAL OBSERVANCES. Throughout the course of this cycle various "lesser festivals" are used on some of the occasions when they happen to fall on Sundays. According to the rubrics of *Evangelical Lutheran Worship—Leaders Desk Edition*, (page 12) lesser festivals do not <u>normally</u> take precedence over the appointed Sunday observances as prescribed in the Revised Common Lectionary. However, these same calendar rubrics in *ELW-Leader's Edition* specify that the following lesser festivals <u>do</u> take precedence: the Name of Jesus (January 1st); and the Presentation of our Lord (February 2nd) in addition to the festivals of Reformation (October 31st) and All Saints (November 1st). Furthermore, the rubrics go on to suggest that the following festivals <u>may</u> replace the usual calendar Sunday material: John the Baptist (June 24th); Peter and Paul, Apostles (June 29th); Mary, Mother of our Lord (August 15th); Holy Cross Day (September 14th); and Michael and All Angels (September 29th). In addition, there are two "<u>major</u> festivals" that either always fall on a weekday (Ascension) or often do so (Epiphany) and they are provided with hymn suggestions in this list, since the rubrics of *ELW—Leaders Desk Edition* (page 10) permit their observance to be switched to a nearby Sunday.

"To Epiphany or not to Epiphany" -- The Festival of the Epiphany of our Lord with its fixed date of January 6th will not fall on a Sunday in 2017, but as a major holiday of the church it should be observed every year, if possible. The pew edition of *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* says that the holiday "may be observed on the <u>second</u> Sunday of Christmas," though this time around, the constraints of the liturgical calendar squeeze out a second Christmas Sunday. (But might it be, considering the integral part that the Epiphany Gospel text plays in the overall Christmas narrative, that it could be used on the <u>first</u> Sunday of Christmas?) On the other hand, January 1, 2017—a Sunday—is the festival of the Name of Jesus, which according to the rubrics does take precedence on a Sunday, and, of course, it also connects to the birth story of Jesus. (See the rubrics in pew edition, page 21, as well as the above mentioned leader's desk edition, page 21.)

In any case, congregations may want to encourage parishioners "to take Epiphany home with them," by distributing pieces of white chalk at the door. The old custom is for the family to pray God's blessing on their home on Epiphany and mark in chalk over the main doorway the following numbers, letters and signs: **20+C+M+B+17**, which, of course, stands for the year, interspersed with crosses and the initials of the traditional names of the magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The following prayer could be prayed by the family: *Bless, O God, this house, that those who live here may always be seeking the Christ, as did the magi when they came from a great distance and found him with his family in their Bethlehem home. May Christ be found in our home during the course of this year, and may he go forth in our hearts whenever we pass through this door to our tasks in the world. May your peace, O God, be known among us through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.*

"Goodbye to Alleluia!" - According to the ancient tradition of the Western Church, we "fast" from the word, "alleluia," during the weeks and Sundays of Lent. From the medieval era comes the tradition of saying formal farewell to Alleluia on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. This usually took the form of a special hymn, and the most famous example is *Alleluia, dulce carmen* [ELW #318 & WOV #654 "Alleluia, Song of Gladness"]. In some places there were customs, often involving children, in which the alleluia was solemnly buried or otherwise disposed of before Lent. A modern version of this ceremony might be to have the children of the parish go in procession around the interior of the church during the singing of "Alleluia, Song of Gladness," carrying a banner with the word, "Alleluia," on it. At the end of the hymn the children could fold the banner and put it in a special box, to be opened and retrieved at the Easter observance.

Another resource for such an observance is the anthem, "Alleluia, Song of Sweetness," as arranged to the tune, PICARDY," by the late Wittenberg University professor of music Donald Busarow, and published by Concordia Publishing House (item #98-2995). The anthem lends itself to a variety of instruments and congregational participation.

Special Southern Ohio Synod Remembrance: On September 14, 1818, the very first Lutheran synod assembly to be held in Ohio convened in the town of Somerset in Perry County. Present were four ordained ministers, six licensed ministerial candidates, and eight lay delegates, who together launched a stronger base for the ministry of their congregations. This meeting could be regarded as the ancestral founding date of what is now the Southern Ohio Synod. (Note that coming up in 2018 will be the **200**th **Anniversary** of organized Lutheranism in Ohio, of which the Southern Ohio Synod is a direct descendant.)

Southern Ohio Synod Partnership Observance: One of our synod's four partnerships with overseas Lutheran regional bodies involves the <u>Sinodo Espirito Santo a Belem</u>, in Brazil: On December 25, 1846 the first Lutheran worship service was held in the Brazilian state of Espirito Santo. This took place in the city of Vittoria and was organized by a group of Lutherans from the area of Pomerania in Germany. The present day Lutheran Synod of Espirito Santo consists of 174 congregations, plus some 75 "preaching points" and includes 59,373 church members. In a partnership relationship with the Southern Ohio Synod, is this one of the 18 constituent synods of the Evangelical Church of the Lutheran Confession in Brazil. Leading the synod is the Rev. Joaninho Borchardt who has the title in Portugese of Pastor Sinodal (Synodical Pastor).

Special Southern Ohio Synod Remembrance: On December 29, 1848 occurred the death of Ezra Keller, a graduate of Gettysburg Seminary, and formerly a traveling missionary in Ohio. Later (1845) he became the founder and first president of Wittenberg University in Springfield, Ohio. This new institution represented a more Americanized type of Lutheranism.

December 25, 2016 – the Nativity of our Lord, Christmas Day

(Many, if not most, of our Southern Ohio Synod congregations have their main celebration of Jesus' birthday on Christmas Eve, December 24th. But this year Christmas Day is a Sunday, so that begs the question of what kind of service to hold on Christmas morning. Evangelical Lutheran Worship (page 20) provides pericopes for a Eucharist, which would be quite appropriate, though many of the same worshipers will have received Communion the previous evening. An alternative for Christmas Sunday morning might be the service given below. The appointed ELW readings for Christmas are included. This "service of the Word" is designed according to a custom developed in the cathedral churches of England. Thematically appropriate choir anthems or solos can be substituted for some of the hymns.

Southern Ohio Synod Partnership Observance: Another of our synod's four overseas partnerships involves the <u>East of Lake Victoria Diocese</u> of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania: on May 14, 1989 the East of Lake Victoria Diocese came into being when 7 parishes were subdivided from the Central Diocese of the national church. (A "diocese" is an area served by a bishop and is thus the equivalent to the synods of the ELCA.) The diocese has since made remarkable growth in an area of Tanzania previously dominated by witchcraft and superstition-laden traditional native religion. The diocese now includes 72 parishes and 47,000 members, and is among the fastest growing of the national church's 20 dioceses. Special Southern Ohio Synod Remembrance: The Southern Ohio Synod held its constituting assembly in Columbus, Ohio, on May 31 - June 2, 1987. As one of the 66 constituent synods of the recently organized Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, our new synod brought together for the lower section of Ohio some 247 congregations of the former American Lutheran Church, the Lutheran Church in American, and the Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches. Historically, this represented a reunification of several strands of Lutheranism that shared common roots dating back to the first Lutheran synod assembly ever held in Ohio. That first synod met on September 14, <u>1818</u>—199 years ago--in the southern Ohio town of Somerset in Perry County, and could be considered the ancestral founding date of our present synod. And <u>2017</u> is the **30th Anniversary of the founding of our synod** within the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

Southern Ohio Synod Partnership Observance: Our synod's oldest overseas partnership involves the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Northern Germany: Dating back to the early 1990s, the Southern Ohio Synod had an ongoing partnership relationship with an autonomous Lutheran church body in the German state of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern. Then on Pentecost in 2012, the previously independent Mecklenburg church joined in "fusion" with two other North German territorial church bodies, creating what is now called the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Northern Germany. (Nickname: die Nordkirche or "the North Church") The largest component of this new church body was the North Elbian Evangelical Lutheran Church, which stretched from Hamburg to Lübeck, and brought along 594 congregations and over 2 million church members. Smaller was the Mecklenburg church with 269 congregations and around 200,000 members. The smallest of the fusing bodies was the Evangelical Church of Pomerania with 202 congregations and around 100,000 members. The Mecklenburg part of the new church will continue its partnership with the Southern Ohio Synod, but now the partnership is also part of the mission of the entire North Church. The new church stretches from the North Sea to Poland, with the Mecklenburg and Pomeranian portions having been behind the Iron Curtain until 1989. The presiding bishop is the Rev. Gerhard Ulrich, and the bishop of the Mecklenburg Diocese is the Rev. Dr. Andreas von Maltzahn.

Southern Ohio Synod Partnership Observance: Seemingly the most remote of our synod's overseas partnerships involves the Evangelical Lutheran Church in the Republic of Kazakhstan. That there are Lutherans in such a far-flung locale came about as a result of the Second World War. On August 28, 1941 the presidium of the Soviet Union ordered the "resettling" of ethnic Germans within the USSR. Stalin feared that these Russian citizens of German descent would welcome and collaborate with the armed forces of the Third Reich, as they began to invade Russia at the end of June 1941. A large population of Russians of Germanic heritage were, as a result, forcibly uprooted from areas where they had lived going back as much as 200 years and moved to the Asian part of the USSR. Many of these people ended up in Kazakhstan, where they maintained a thriving Lutheran church life, although deprived for decades from any church contacts with the West. Since the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1990, many of the ethnic Germans in Kazakhstan have immigrated to Germany, so that the Kazakh church has been much reduced in size. At the same time, it began to face pronounced problems from the Muslim Kazakh majority running the government. Nevertheless, the Lutheran church in Kazakhstan lives on, with Bishop Yuri Novgorodov, and 11 other pastors plus 33 preachers serving the 54 congregations of the Kazakh church.
