Rev. Dr. Joy Schroeder is the Bergener Professor Theology and Religion at Capital University and Profess of Church History at Trinity Lutheran Seminary. She has served in this position since 2000. She is a graduate of Luther College, 1985; M.Div., Princeton Theological Seminary, 1988; M.A., Ph.D., University of Notre Dame, 1997, 2000; Assistant Pastor, St. Mark

Lutheran Church, Davenport, IA, 1990-94; Assistant Pastor, Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, South Bend, IN, 1995-97; Assistant Professor of Religion, Luther College, 1999- 2000; Bergener Professor of Theology and Religion, Trinity and Capital University, 2000-; Assistant Professor of Church History, Trinity, 2000-2006; Associate Professor of Church History, Trinity, 2006-. Acting Director of Graduate Studies, 2008-09; Professor of Church History, Trinity, 2011-. Dr. Schroeder is associated with the North American Patristics Society, Sixteenth Century Society and Conference, Society of Biblical Literature, and the Society for the Study of Early Modern Women. Her publications are many including: *The Book of Genesis*. Wm. B. Eerdmans Publishing Co.; Tra edition, 2015 and *Deborah's Daughters: Gender Politics and Biblical Interpretation*. Oxford University Press, 2014. She has also written articles for *Lutheran Woman Today* and *The Lutheran*.
